Session Synopsis of October 19, 2022

Two special meetings were held in early October. The first was for the purpose of welcoming two additional new members, Michael and Suk McKee, who formally joined our church family with Michael and Denise Walker on October 2, 2022. Also on that day, we gathered after worship for the Fall Congregational Meeting for the purpose of electing new officers. We were pleased to unanimously elect Jeanne Turner as elder joining the Class of 2024; and we were also pleased to unanimously elect Sheya Bennett, Gina and Jim Peyton, and Bonnie Swarner as Deacons in the Class of 2024. Emily Golding was elected as a youth deacon to the class of 2023.

A great deal of business was conducted at the regular October Session meeting. New officers-elect attended this meeting for official "examination," but first was a review of the expectations of Elders and Deacons. This included praying for each other and the wider community, respecting confidentiality, listening to understand, being open to change, and overall serving as role models for what we want our church community to be. This also included the responsibility of *all* to exhibit good stewardship, which was perfect timing as the Stewardship campaign is currently taking place! Officers-elect were then asked to share what brought them to FPCV and what they hoped to learn during their term in office. Interestingly, half of the new officers grew up in the church while half were fairly new members. Following discussion, the "examination" was arrested, newly elected officers were welcomed, and ordination/installation has been scheduled for January 8, 2023. Please welcome these new officers!

Unfortunately, the scheduled retreat at Geneva Center the weekend of October 15-16 did not happen. Nevertheless, Dr. Drew Benson from LeaderWise, who was part of the planning team for the retreat, joined the Session meeting with some observations as well as some activities. Several questions had been asked of Elders in preparation for the retreat which are questions that all members could ask themselves as well:

- 1. What is the church doing well?
- 2. Does the congregation have a strong sense of its vision/mission?
- 3. What is happening at church that gets in the way?

Elders then formed small groups and were asked to summarize the <u>Gospel</u> in six (6) words! There were some interesting answers:

- 1. Challenging, Comforting, Inspiring, Life-changing, Educational, Revealing!
- 2. God's history works in many ways!
- 3. God's sacrifice, God's relationship, compelled to action!
- 4. Love God, Love others, no exceptions!
- 5. Without sharing the Word, it stops!
- 6. Love, service, grace, wisdom, openness, action!

After sharing these responses, it was observed that many of the words chosen were ACTION words, verbs, indicating an energy that exists and can be focused into actions and that leans into personal relationships.

SESSION SYNOPSIS OF OCTOBER 19, 2022, CONTINUED

A few other highlights of the meeting included the following:

- 1. High School seniors Leah and Luke Ribordy have asked Session to allow a fundraising effort as part of the VHS National Honor Society to raise money for St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. Session unanimously and enthusiastically approved!
- 2. Membership Clerk Elizabeth Monroe and Clerk Judy Hollar attended the Annual Presbytery Review of Records in early October and their books and records were approved without exception!
- 3. Elders are beginning to work on Annual Reports and Events Calendars, both of which will be due December 9.
- 4. All are encouraged to attend and support the Faith Formation Trunk or Treat event on October 21 as it is one of the biggest outreach activities of the year.
- 5. A first draft of the 2023 budget was presented with a time for questions and discussion. Hopefully, a final budget will be constructed following Celebration Sunday when pledges are to be turned in (which will determine how active our ministry can be). As has been noted, the Spiritual Health of a community can be seen by its giving!
- 6. Our own Elder Ron Phillips has been commissioned to serve Communion in churches in the absence of a pastor!

Only three other **MOTIONS** were <u>approved</u>:

- 1. From Finance: To transfer the remaining Herron Funds (approximately \$9,446) to the capital fund, reserved for consulting fees for the capital campaign in 2023.
- 2. Also from Finance: To transfer \$30,000 from Account 8237 Welter Fund to capital fund as match for \$25,000 Smock grant restricted to ADA compliant improvements and as foundational support for the 2023 capital campaign.
- 3. From Deacons: To allow Home Communion for the Deacon Friends either November 6, 2022, or November 20, 2022, depending upon when Advent Bags are delivered.

Joys & Concerns

- Pastor Kim offered thanks for prayers offered during her recent illness with Covid, and she also requested that everyone *please* be up to date on all vaccinations and boosters!
- Pastor Kim also offered thanks for the love she received and truly felt when presented with the surprise cards on Pastor Appreciation Sunday; they were a huge help during her illness.
- Continued prayers for a child struggling with separation anxiety
- Concern that there was a considerable budget deficit at the end of September



"MATTHEW 25 REFLECTION" presents information chosen by our Matthew 25 Team to inform and inspire our church family to actively engage in activities and with initiatives that reduce MATTHEW 25 poverty and racism in our local communities and beyond.

Minor Feelings Book Review

Matthew 25 Team recently hosted a book discussion on racism from an Asian American perspective. We discussed a book of essays by Cathy Park Hong, who is Korean, called Minor Feelings. We learned that dialogue with and listening to minority peoples' own experiences with an open heart can teach us a great deal. For instance....

Our own feelings and stereotypes often get in the way of true understanding.

- > There is not just ONE minority experience: individuals have many different experiences, often based on their family structure, their education, where they live, their economic status, etc.
- > Discounting the feelings of *any* minority group divides them and benefits the majority.
- > Raised where whiteness and assimilation are venerated and often taught that their own cultural heritage is inferior, many Asian Americans are unable to defend their personal characteristics and are thus devoid of a true identity.
- > Asian Americans have been stereotyped as the "quintessential model for minorities: well behaved, compliant, hardworking, quiet, unthreatening and discreet." This creates conflicting feelings for them as they struggle to keep up this facade.
- > The myth of a model minority ultimately undermines other minorities, such as the African American, Native American or Latinx who are deemed to be more unruly, dangerous, unmanageable, and thus more undeserving.
- > Being "model" minority members often comes by sacrificing or suppressing their own cultural identity and heritage (whether Asian, Indigenous, Latinx, or even Polish, Irish, or Italian!) which they are taught is considered to be inferior.
- > Asian Americans have often been told: "You are the next in line to be white" which causes conflict for them: should they act white or act like a minority?
- > Should assimilation into white society be the goal or should minorities maintain their heritage?
- > The title of the book, *Minor Feelings*, can mean many things: being in a *minority*; being made to feel *less* than; being made to feel *unimportant*; minor feelings arise from repeatedly having perceptions of racism in your own life dismissed. The everyday experiencing of slights, knowing they are racial, and being told, "Oh that's all in your head" produces feelings of bitterness, shame, melancholy, and paranoia.

You can find a copy of the book (along with a print out of some information from Beth Germann's participation in the Sacred Ground study by the Episcopal Church) can be found in the library. You could read the first two essays and the last to encounter the major concepts of the book. Please come join our future book discussions as we learn from one another, as well as from the book at hand.
