PADS MINISTRY INFORMATION VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

FPCV hosts PADS on Wednesday evening 6:00 PM through Thursday morning 7:00 AM October 16, 2024, through April 9, 2025.

PADS is a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing emergency shelter for men in our community. PADS offers a comprehensive approach to combating homelessness with the compassion and respect all deserve.

FPCV is transformed each Wednesday so that we can serve dinner that evening, provide a warm and comfortable place to sleep, and serve breakfast on Thursday morning. Last year we averaged 8-12 men per week.

PADS is for men only, who are in the program at New Creation to help them find jobs and housing so that they no longer need to be part of the PADS program. In the past years many men have succeeded in finding jobs and housing. We celebrate them!

FPCV is a cooperative effort with other area congregations and the community in general. Anyone can volunteer to help. A volunteer form needs to be completed. St Andrews Church and Trinity Lutheran Church help FPCV with volunteers, dinners, bedding and supplies.

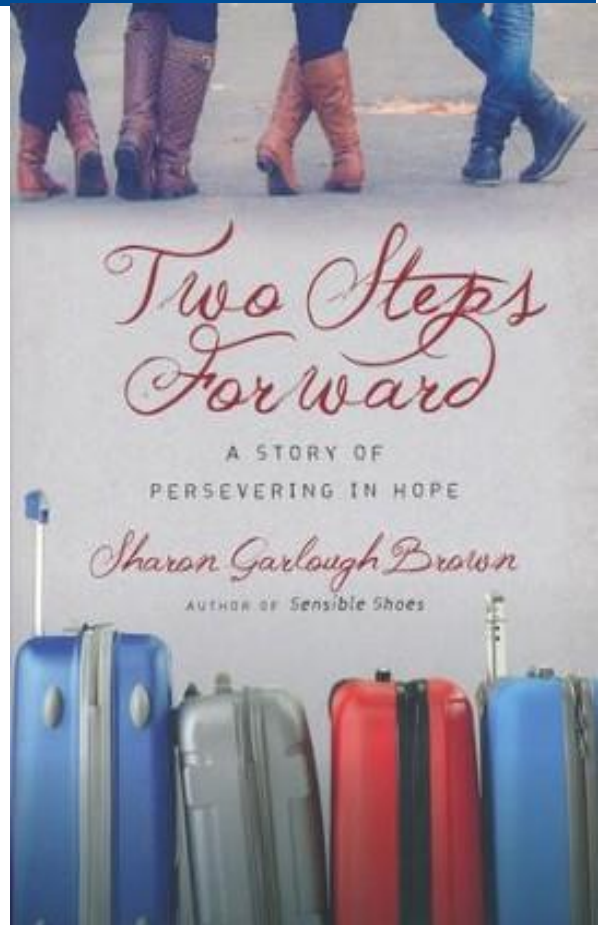

Dear Friends,

INFORMED GIVING... IF YOU ARE 70 1/2 OR OLDER AND HAVE AN IRA

Since they doubled the standard deduction, ninety percent of us can no longer take a tax deduction for money we give to the church. **However, we can eliminate the taxes due on any money we take from an IRA...** IF the money is sent directly from our account to the church.

At age 70 ½, we may begin to voluntarily take money from an IRA.

Those of us, 73 or older, must take a specified amount, our Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), from our IRA each year. Any time we take money out of an IRA, we must pay the taxes we avoided when we put the money in.

Here is an example:

Assume Mary's RMD requires her to take \$3,000 out of her IRA this year. She also wants to give \$3,000 to the church for The Sharing Table.

Option 1) She can have this money sent to herself. It is considered income, and she would pay \$720 more income tax (if she is in the 24% tax bracket). $\$3,000 - (\$720 \text{ taxes}) = \$2,280$.

She has only \$2,280 to give to the church because she will owe \$720 at tax time.

Option 2a) She can request her RMD money be sent **directly** to First Presbyterian Church Valparaiso, and she **would pay no taxes on this money.** $\$3,000 - \$0 = \$3,000$ will be transferred in her name to the church!

The government takes \$0 in taxes!

Option 2b) If she wants to donate only \$2,000 directly to the church, she can have the remaining \$1,000 (\$760 after taxes) sent to herself.

Donations from your IRA (required or voluntary) transferred directly to the church are called: **Qualified Charitable Deductions (QCD'S).**

So, if Mary has the check sent to her, **she only has \$2,280 to give to the church after paying the taxes.**

By having the money sent directly to the church (**via a QCD**), **Mary can donate the full \$3,000!**

All it takes is a phone call to the custodian of your IRA (or your accountant/financial advisor). They can help you set up the process (paperwork) and timing for sending out your QCD checks this year. **To avoid the steep penalty for forgetting to take your RMD, it might be wise to consider this option soon for this year.**

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH RESALE SHOP NEWS



As Christians, we are called to be loving, caring and generous people. As a volunteer with the Presbyterian Church Resale Shop, I thought I was “doing my bit.” This year, I have had the opportunity to hand deliver donation checks to seven local non-profit organizations. My eyes have been opened to the tremendous needs in our community and to the wide range of services that these groups attempt to provide.



The Resale Shop is not just giving money. We are supporting real people with critical needs. We are helping to provide affordable housing, safe shelters, food and services for those struggling with addiction and mental and physical disabilities.

Our volunteers are working every day to live into our Matthew 25 pledge.

I urge you to join me in this mission opportunity. I invite you to have your eyes opened too.

You've probably remembered that we have new neighbors in Valparaiso who fled from Venezuela and last spring were legally granted asylum to enter the US. This family of six includes Luz (mom), Nolberto (dad), Andrea, Stevan, Sebastian and Miguel. They live near our church and are slowly getting integrated into our community. Two of the children attend a local school, two are enrolled at another local school in the dual-language program. Miguel was welcomed to our preschool for a few weeks after their arrival this past spring, so they are not strangers to some of us.



Life for them is unquestionably challenging each day right now. Upon arriving, they spoke little English and had nothing but the clothes on their backs. They are learning English slowly, but Luz in particular is pretty quick with using Google Translate in a conversation! Our social benefits system for families who arrive with nothing is a labyrinth of administrative processes. There is a multitude of application paperwork, medical appointments, newfangled benefits cards, how to get “cash back” to pay for needs beyond food, reporting requirements, going through driver’s training again with an Indiana learner’s permit, and other similar cultural, language and procedural hurdles to get past. Regional Catholic Charities relief funds, the support agency assigned to the family by the government, have dried up after three months although the family and their Valpo support group were told initially they could expect six months of rental support.

Mom has a part-time job, and Dad has been working part-time in Winfield, but started a full-time job in Valpo on September 16th. They continue to look for affordable childcare for their kindergartener. Currently, they rely upon their bicycles and volunteer drivers to get around until the dad gets an Indiana driver’s license (six months waiting period, with a pending request to waive that requirement) and a family car. FPCV is part of the self-organizing “Valparaiso Refugee Family Support Group” that has been meeting regularly once we knew for sure in February that the family was approved. So far, our joint reserve funds have been enough as we walk with the family during their first months. They are working hard toward self-sufficiency and a sense of belonging in Valpo. Christ Lutheran Church’s social justice folks have welcomed two of us from FPCV’s Mission Team to join the “executive team” for planning, decisions and actions to support these new neighbors. Christ Lutheran folks have done the heavy lifting, but our Mission Team budget and a few individual directed donations provided some temporary rent support in Costa Rica while they were awaiting US processing for their entry applications. Our Mission Team helped with cell phones when they first arrived, move-in assistance and some gifts of used furnishings, summer camp and swim lessons at the Y for the kids this summer, and partial support for a three-bedroom apartment.

This “VRF Support Group” is forecasting, based on the experience of other newly arrived and government-sanctioned refugees, that it will take around \$15,000 during the first year to supplement the family’s entry-level earnings and benefits to support the six of them while they get settled in our community. Already, the family is budgeting and working closely on job referrals and references, relying on community resources like our Presbyterian Church Resale Shop and the Christian Food Pantry and Hilltop, and benefits like Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP/food stamp) and (limited) temporary assistance for needy families. The kids are getting around town with bikes and the V-Line. A team of volunteers drive them to employment opportunities not served by the V-Line, take them to medical and agency appointments, make trips to the grocery store and food pantries, serve as translators in appointments and meetings when needed, tutor the children in English on their homework, and the like.

This fall we have been pondering “**What we were made for...**” One answer that echoes each Sunday is what Matthew 25 teaches us: “Love God and love your neighbor.” Jesus tells us, “I assure you that when you have done it for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you have done it for me.” Anyone interested in making a special gift can do so through our FPCV mission fund for Immigrant Relief. Any volunteer with some time to be a driver when there is need, such as a trip to shop for groceries or to take Mom or Dad to the food pantry can make that known by contacting Linda Long at 219-707-2091. The Mission Team welcomes all of us willing to pitch in, however you are moved by the Spirit. These are our neighbors, right down the street.
