

SESSION SYNOPSIS OF MAY 22, 2024

Phew! The May Session meeting was long, but your Elders accomplished a great deal! They approved 11 substantive motions; tabled 3 motions which needed more time for study; approved 12 additional reports; discussed 5 more important topics; and shared at least 18 Joys and Concerns. And they did all of this in service to and love for God and you, the Congregation!

The **discussion items** deserve mentioning first:

- "How Safe is your Place of Worship" is an important workshop being presented by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance in Elkhart on Saturday, June 15. Unfortunately, no one from Building & Grounds Team is able to attend, but they are hopeful that one or two members of the Congregation might be interested. Please check elsewhere in this Tidings as well as in the Sunday bulletins or contact Jerry Kahrs (jerry.kahrs@icloud.com) or Vic Klancer (vic-klancer@comcast.net) for more information. Please pray to discern if God is calling you to help FPC Valpo by attending this workshop.
- An upcoming expense is resurfacing the parking lots, and part of this conversation includes what to do with the west parking area. Our church is definitely trying to be more environmentally friendly (note the progress on the solar panels being installed on the roof!) so a natural extension of this discussion included possibly turning all or part of that west lot into a natural/green space. Session recommended that B&G investigate parameters for doing just that, so if you have an interest in what Session could/should do along these lines, please contact Jerry or Vic to help explore some possibilities.
- Also involving the parking lots is the opportunity to use them for a possible 4th of July Fundraiser as has been done several times in the past. If your Bible Study group or Ministry Team is interested in making a few signs and collecting for a cause that is aligned with our mission, Session has already approved the fundraiser. Just contact Clerk Judy Hollar (<u>ibhollar49@gmail.com</u>) to get things scheduled.
- Elders discussed the possibility of using the church's Realm software through a hands-on training to facilitate communication between Session members as well as with the congregation. Further exploration and training will be investigated.
- Elder Harry Karabel welcomed questions regarding the inclusivity workshop led by Rev. Carol McDonald on May 11. He shared that the most important thing he learned was that becoming a more inclusive church is NOT just about LGBTQIA+ but includes everyone in every type of community. He challenged elders to consider thoughtfully whether our church should join the Covenant Network of Presbyterians which will provide resources and connect us with organizations who are interested in doing what we are doing. Session will be making the decision in June.

- ⇒ Approved a \$5,000 designated donation to the Scholarship Fund from an anonymous donor
- ⇒ <u>Approved</u> a fundraising concert featuring Ken Medema on Sunday, June 9, to benefit Project Neighbors

As a US representative for Roma Networks, Tom's priority is to bring people together to support initiatives among the Roma including church plantings, Bible training, youth work, job creation, and community development.

Tom and Dora currently reside in Chesterton after having lived in the Czech Republic nearly 15 years and worked in the regions of Bosnia, Serbia and Herzegovina. Tom has just returned from the 4th Annual Roma Networks Conference in Albania (attended by over 300 church workers from all over Europe, where they network to support education, job creation and the Roma Bible School to create a school tailored for the Balkan context). Tom and Dora also raise Golden Retrievers, have five children (Amy, Matous, Hannah, Axel and Nate) and spend sabbatical time with Tom's parents, Mike and Pastor Nancy Becker.



REV. DR. BUSBY received his medical doctorate (MD, cum laude) degree and Master of Science (MSc) degree in biophysics from the University of Western Ontario in Canada. His post-graduate studies at The Ohio State University and the Lovelace Foundation led to his being certified as a specialist in Aerospace Medicine. In ministry, he received his Master of Divinity (MDiv) degree from the Chicago Theological Seminary and his Doctor of Ministry (DMin) and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degrees from the Graduate Theological Foundation. He has been an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ for 26 years, serving as an instructor at the Chicago Theological Seminary, an interim (transitional) minister, and a pulpit supply minister. He has preached and lectured on spiritual healing in several Protestant denominations and practiced spiritual healing in many churches, hospitals, homes, and other venues. His 67 publications include the first book on clinical problems from hazards of space operations and two books on spiritual healing. He has recently told his life story to date in "My Experiences in Medicine, Theology, and Along the Way," a book published by Amazon.



SHARING TABLE

If you don't feel the energy around the church now, you will soon. It's gonna get electric at FPCV. The session approved a project to install 190 solar voltaic panels facing south on the flat roof areas. A contract has been signed with Advanced Solar LLC of Warsaw, Indiana to install a 75-kw solar panel system. Total installation is estimated to take 6 to 8 weeks this spring with the system operational as soon as installation is complete and required inspections have been completed by NIPSCO. This summer the panels could be producing electricity for FPCV.

The Building and Grounds team set an objective of reducing our utility costs and becoming more environmentally responsible. This is a good project to keep us moving in that direction. The proposed system uses clean, renewable energy from the sun, helps to reduce our dependance on fossil fuels, insulates FPCV from constantly increasing utility rates and should be maintenance free, Depending on a number of factors such as utility rates and daily electrical consumption patterns, the system should pay for itself within a 7 or 8 year period through savings in our utility bills.

This project falls into the Sharing Table Project of Caring for our Facility in terms of our building, community, and environment. The Federal Rebate of 30%, authorized under the Inflation Reduction Act of 2022, will be applied for upon completion of the project with those funds returning to STP for other projects. An incentive created to move to renewable energy to the benefit of the environment for all communities. This big step to reduce our carbon footprint is one to be proud of. I will share a couple websites with more information on the benefits of this choice than I could put in this letter: For information on a mission of the PCUSA, google "Earth Care Congregations", Interfaith Power and Light provides ideas for congregations to cut carbon emissions on a website "Cool Congregations". Take a look at some of the activities presented on both sites. If you find yourself motivated to start a small group with other interested members of the church to pursue some more steps for environmental stewardship, talk to me so we can make it happen.

This project also falls into other action categories from the Sharing Table Project. Under New Member Outreach, we want to communicate this story to the community. We could be listed as an Earth Care Congregation or a Cool Congregation with the groups which run the websites listed above which may grow a new Community Partnerships. Utilizing information from these websites or other sources, we may Grow Learning Opportunities in stewardship of the earth. And the future Funding of the Mission Plan will be improved as our utility expenses are decreased. The opportunities to be stewards of the Earth's environment is becoming a topic of discussion for us to Share at the Table. I look forward to being at the table with the Congregation.
