SESSION SYNOPSIS OF JANUARY 20, 2021

Virtually **EVERYONE** is glad to have 2020 behind us, and Session too is looking forward, welcoming five new Elders and two guests to a packed agenda for the start of 2021! The Zoom meeting began with a review of Robert's Rules of Order (to facilitate smoothly run meetings that allow all to have voice) and a review of all current Session Policies. The beginning of the year is a good time for Session *and* Ministry teams to review our church policies and update them as needed (which also requires Session approval).

Deacon Moderator Nancy Porter gave Session an overview of the work of the Deacons, including the Deacon Friend program as well as the FPVC Outreach/Phone Tree Communication Project which was begun due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Both Elders and Deacons wish to continue this program, so Elders Sharon Kinsey and Jacki Phillips will be working with Nancy and the Board of Deacons to ensure its continued success. Deacons were invited to attend the May Session meeting, and Elders extended their hands as Pastor Kim blessed the work of the Deacons.

Elders also had the opportunity to meet and welcome (via Zoom) **Jeff Whitney**, our recently hired Director of Technology. Jeff has already been working hard with the production of on-line offerings, and the Worship and iEngage teams are especially grateful to have him join us.

Session is also beginning a new practice called **Holy Living**. Each month, all Elders will offer daily prayers for two Ministry Teams; additionally two Elders will be offering prayers for the community, and two Elders will be reflecting on the worship experiences throughout the month. At each Session meeting, they will share observations of how the prayers impacted their lives throughout the month. This month, reflections included how awesome it was to be prayed for and how the Holy Spirit had been present, but also how great the needs of our community really are, especially during this pandemic. The question was also posed: *Why aren't we as kind in March as we are in December (during Advent/Christmas)?*

January meetings are often long with so much annual business that needs to take place. This included authorizing the **celebration of the Lord's Supper** [on the first Sunday of each month, Holy Days (Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Easter, Christmas Eve, Christmas), the Great Banquet, additional Advent and Lenten services, Pines Village, etc.] either in person or via virtual service platform of choice; authorizing **weddings**; and electing Judy Hollar as **Clerk of Session**, Susan Grosick as Membership Clerk, Ruth Dickey as **Treasurer**, Sharon Kinsey as **President of the Corporation**, and Ken McAloon as **Secretary of the Corporation**. Trish Lawson was appointed as the second elder member of the Congregational Nominating Committee. The **2020 Annual Report** was approved and will be presented to the Congregation at the Annual Meeting January 31, 2021, via Zoom. In addition, Kim Croarkin and Sharon Kinsey were elected to represent the Congregation as **Elder Commissioners** at the Presbytery Assembly meeting on February 27, 2021.

In addition, several other topics were discussed, including the following:

- Personnel presented a revised **Terms of Call** for Pastor Kim which was approved and will be presented at the Congregational meeting on January 31, 2021. She will forgo the approved 3% raise due to our budgetary concerns but will receive an additional week of vacation.
- There will be a Called Meeting of Session on Sunday, January 24, 2021, via Zoom, to approve the **2021 Operating Budget**.
- The **Annual Church Statistical Report** for Presbytery was approved (and will be presented to the Congregation as part of the Annual Report).
- Session approved Worship's request to have an **in-person outdoor Sunrise Service** option on Easter Sunday, April 4, 2021, under the pavilion or at another suitable location TBD.

Session closed out the meeting by sharing **Joys and Concerns**. These included the positive effect of having so many in the congregation praying for those who are grieving, hurting, ill, or suffering in other ways; the uplifting and worshipful Advent and Christmas Eve services; the laying on of hands video during the Ordination of Officers; the excitement of a new year with new officers beginning their ministries; and of course concern for those who ARE still suffering in a variety of ways.

If you would like more information, please read the detailed minutes which will be *posted in the glass-enclosed announcement board* in the Hospitality Center once they are approved (and we are allowed back into the church!). **In the meantime**, please contact any of the Elders and/or the Clerk if you have questions or are interested in further details.

CHANCEL VISIONING TEAM NEWS

As we continue to navigate the pandemic and make decisions to keep our team members, church members and our partners at Elevate Studios safe, the work of the Chancel Visioning Team has taken small steps forward in this past month, mostly around technical needs and details related to the initial design proposal. These initial steps are building the foundation for larger things that will be reported in future months but for now we have included the bullet point highlights shared last month as a reminder of where we are in the process.

Until we have a larger update to provide, we would like to leave you with two words...**UNITY AND HOPE.**

UNITY because we truly believe that the work we are doing as the CVT will help our congregation restore unity in our corporate worship by providing us with the space, technology and spirit-filled atmosphere needed to come together as one worshipping body with countless diverse and perfectly imperfect gifts.

HOPE because dreaming and visioning a common project together is a powerful way to bring excitement and joy into our congregation. Let us approach this endeavor with a hopeful exuberance of what we can accomplish together as we celebrate our differences and plan for FPCV's future.

- In November, our congregation's Chancel Visioning Team spent a day in Zoom meetings with our architectural firm Elevate Studio and our ministry teams to talk about our worship history and hopes and dreams for enhancing our sacred space.
- In December, the Elevate Team synthesized what it learned from our diverse points of view to move toward core ideas they will address in their design proposals. Additionally, Elevate's audio technician performed an evaluation of our sanctuary's acoustics.
- In January, the Elevate Team and your Chancel Visioning Team plan to meet through Zoom for a face-to-face conversation to review and revise as necessary those core ideas and plan next steps toward preparing design proposals to share with Session and the congregation. Depending on our measured pace as the pandemic continues to unfold around us, perhaps those ideas will be ready to share in early spring.

NEW TEAM AT FPC VALPARAISO

VIRBRANT CONGREGATION COMMITTEE

In the Vibrant Congregations Initiative, a congregational coaching project through a grant from the Smock Foundation, eight Presbyterian churches in Indiana will spend 18 months Imagining, Telling, and Living a New Story. During an initial retreat, the vibrant in Valparaiso, the FPCV Vibrant Congregation Leadership Team, set an intention for the beginning of this journey: To define, realistically, who we are, our authentic identity, not what we aspire to be, celebrating our joys, gifts and mission.

As part of being a Matthew 25 congregation, we explore building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty. Our committee of six has been wrestling with the concept of who we are. We have come to the understanding that we are a congregation of a variety of ways of thinking; and therefore, it is very difficult to put us “into a box” that describes us as a whole. That is one of our strengths though because there is room for all at our table.

Our work will attempt to identify our gifts and strengths and help us as a congregation imagine what we can do with those gifts to best be the hands and feet of Jesus to the world around us. This year has presented many challenges, but also opportunities to recognize some strengths and work in new and creative ways to fulfill our mission.

We may not be worshipping together in person, but the church is still at work. Another strength of ours is that we are able to carry on despite disruptions. This congregation has a strong faith and is very giving. Our missions did not suffer financially during this year and we should rejoice in that. And we are sure that the new normal we will experience will present us with many opportunities to expand our ministry and mission.

We look forward to seeing the fruits of our labor manifest in the future of our congregation. May you all have a blessed 2021 and continue to be a blessing to this church with the variety of gifts you possess.
