SESSION SYNOPSIS OF FEBRUARY 16, 2022

The February Session Meeting is always a Joint Meeting with the Deacons. This year, six Deacons were able to attend: Nancy Porter, Betty Richardson, Joy Dirks, Cathy Greenawald, Linda Marrs and Cindy Robinson and were welcomed by Pastor Kim.

ELDER TRAINING:

Fittingly, the topic of this month's elder training was about Deacons: The Ministry of Compassion & Service, and about Ruling Elders: The Ministry of Discernment & Governance. The Elders and Deacons were to have read the information detailed about each as found in the Book of Order. Some good conversation took place, and it was noted that the Deacons are a ministry of Session in addition to being a ministry of compassion and caring.

TEAM OF THE MONTH: Deacons *{Each month one of the Ministry Teams takes responsibility for describing their work and responsibilities, are prayed for by the other teams and report how that felt, what they learned being in prayer for the wider community + give reflections on worship}.*

- Deacons are vital to the life of our church and have multiple responsibilities, the most recognized being communicating and staying connected with members of our congregation throughout the year. Each Elder spoke briefly about how he/she views and appreciates the work of the Deacons, especially how dedicated they are and how well they have kept in touch with the congregation throughout these trying times of the pandemic.
- The Deacons noted that since they are charged with praying for others, it is an adjustment for some of them to accept being prayed-for.
- Pastor Kim and Session not only prayed for the Deacons but expressed openly their importance and how much their compassion and caring are felt by all who come in contact with them.

REGULAR BUSINESS:

- Accepted were the reports submitted by Ministry Teams, from Staff, approved Minutes of past meetings.
- Established Commissioners for the upcoming Presbytery of Wabash Valley Assembly on February 26th. Elders Karen Mitseff and Sharon Kinsey will represent FPCV.
- Began working on a process for scheduling Communion Servers for the rest of 2022, so that each Communion has its servers pre-established. Any ordained Elder (once an Elder always an Elder) is eligible to serve communion and it is hoped all those who are eligible to serve will feel called to participate in communion as a server at least once throughout the coming year.

- Finance & Stewardship Team moved: **To authorize Linda Long as Treasurer Pro Tem to conduct banking business on behalf of the church.** (Even though the entire Finance & Stewardship Team is collectively assuming the responsibilities of Treasurer of the Corporation on a pro tem basis, it is practical to have a single person be the point of contact.) **APPROVED**
- Buildings & Grounds moved: **To allow local Girl Scout Brownie Troupe #35651 to sell and distribute Girl Scout cookies in and around the Narthex, Main Entrance, Drive-through and adjacent Parking Lot on March 13, 2022, from 9:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.** **APPROVED**
- Congregational Life moved: **To approve the Annual FF/CL Car Wash & Yard Sale scheduled on Saturday, June 18, 2022 with a freewill donation for the carwash going to the Mission Trip and \$20 fee for table rental and freewill offering at the yard sale to go to Congregational Life.** **APPROVED**
- Congregational Life moved: **To approve the 2nd Annual Holiday Craft Fair on Saturday, November 12, 2022, in Fellowship Hall including a \$25.00 table rental fee.** **APPROVED**

- Congregational Life moved: **To approve a Palm Sunday Walking Path Procession/Brown Bag Lunch event on April 10, 2022, following 10:00 a.m. worship. APPROVED** (Weather permitting, lunch to be held in/around the pavilion and ‘to-go’ options. If inclement weather, a lunch ‘to-go’ option will be offered.
- Congregational Life moved: **To enter into a partnership with Hoosier Environmental Council (“HEC”) APPROVED** (This partnership simply gives us access to a lot of good information about renewable energy options we may want to consider as well as access to what issues exist where it might be appropriate for our church to be involved.)
- Faith Formation moved: **To approve a pancakes-to-go fundraiser on Saturday, March 12, 2022, from 8:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m., with ticket sales to occur pre and post-worship on Sundays 2/20, 2/27, and 3/6, and at the time of the event. Funds from the event will support the FPCV summer mission trip. APPROVED**
- Faith Formation moved: **To approve an Ash Wednesday Family Worship Service to be held on Wednesday, March 2, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary. APPROVED**
- Faith Formation moved: **To approve locating a ‘Dedicated Offering Box’ in the Narthex throughout Lent with donations going to the Mission Trip fund. APPROVED**
- Worship Team moved: **To approve an Outdoor Easter Sunrise Service in addition to Sunday AM worship on Easter Sunday. APPROVED**
- iEngage Team moved: **To approve use of available restricted funds up to \$3,000 to purchase a dedicated computer and Pro-Presenter software to improve our Sunday morning visual presentations and provide on-screen lyrics for those that stream or view our worship services virtually. APPROVED** (This software is user friendly and will allow our Media Techs to operate more effectively and efficiently. The church does not have a dedicated computer for live-streaming and we have been relying on members’ personal computers, some of which are not as updated as needed, to help with our live-streaming and in support of our virtual worship services.)
- Personnel Moved: **To add Martin Luther King Day, now a recognized Federal holiday, as a paid holiday for all staff, clergy and non-clergy. APPROVED**

Praises/Joys/Prayers/Concerns:

Prayers were requested for this congregation and for our Deacons who carry out such an important role within it. Prayers for peace in this world where rising tensions and global clashes may erupt into violence or war at any time.

“Nurses of Color Fight ‘Open Wound’/Majority report bias and disrespect in workplace”

Every day, Kechinyere IheduruAnderson walked into work at a Massachusetts hospital with her fingers crossed, holding her breath. The Black, Nigerian-born nurse braced herself for the demeaning treatment.

Her supervisors brushed off patient taunts. Her white counterparts doubted the accuracy of her patient charts, looking for faults. She watched as senior staff bossed around Black nursing assistants. She’d pray her caustic co-workers weren’t on the surgical unit schedule that day. For years, she said, higher-ups dismissed her complaints, citing the longtime careers of some of her co-workers. “Are you sure you didn’t misunderstand?” they said.

Iheduru-Anderson stuck it out. A nurse of three decades, she lives in Mount Pleasant, Michigan, and directs Central Michigan University’s nursing program. She’s dedicated her career to researching racism within the nursing field and mentoring young nurses of color. “The history of nursing is rooted in segregation and discrimination. It is a microcosm of what is happening in society,” she said. “For the most trusted profession, it is kind of ironic, isn’t it? The profession that is supposed to care for people that cannot even care for its own constituents.”

A survey of more than 5,600 nurses by the National Commission to Address Racism in Nursing reported an overwhelming majority of nurses of color say they experienced or witnessed racism. More than 90% of Black nurses surveyed say they’ve experienced racism. More than 70% of Asian nurses report the same, along with 69% of Hispanic nurses. About 3 of 4 nurses say they witnessed racism in the workplace. More than half say they challenged racialized treatment in the workplace, and 64% said no changes resulted from their efforts. About 70% of the Black nurses surveyed report experiencing discrimination directly from health care facility leaders, 68% from patients and 66% from their own peers.

Increasing awareness of racism in nursing was one of the main goals of the survey, said Ernest Grant, the commission’s co-leader and president of the American Nurses Association. “It’s like an open wound that continues to fester, and it’s not going to get better. If anything, it’s going to get worse,” he said. “By bringing this issue to the light, we can begin to address it as a profession.” Nurses of color are underrepresented in the registered nurse workforce. A Health Resources and Services Administration survey found 73% of the nation’s registered nurses are white; 7.8% are Black, 5.2% are Asian, 10% are Hispanic or Latino, and less than 1% Indigenous.

Grant said he hopes the findings encourage leaders within the field to face their biases and help cultivate a culture of respect for nurses of color. The nursing field needs to be welcoming, he said, so up-and-coming minority nurses know “no matter what color your skin is, that you have a voice and that you are respected.”

REFLECTION:

What are my immediate feelings and thoughts when a non-white nurse enters the room to attend to me? Are they any different than when a white nurse enters the room?

Prayer in response to today’s article:

Lord, help me to honestly reflect upon the biases that my up-bringing and life experiences have instilled in me. Help me to examine their validity through the lens of your love and grace for all. Help me to replace them with a new understanding and compassion for all who are suffering from poverty and racism. Amen

As we read, study, and discuss Matthew 25 issues, we need God’s help in fully recognizing the injustice and inequality that continues to exist because of systemic poverty and structural racism. Please add your voice daily in asking that God guide us and empower us, individually and as a church family, in our Matthew 25 efforts. We also need His help in finding meaningful ways for us to act in response to our love and concern.
