Water is truly an amazing substance. This past week I watched nine straight days of snow fall from the heavens. I shoveled it, walked in it, tried to melt it and even drove on it. Today, this snow is beginning to melt into water. Thank God!

Water is so common.

Its chemical composition is the bonding of two gases, hydrogen and oxygen. We are familiar with its various forms from steam; to the liquid; to the solid, ice and snow. We drink it, bathe in it, swim in it, float over it, generate electricity with it, soak the grass with it and buy special clothes for it.

Water is a remarkable substance given to us by God.

When you think about it, water is rather amazing in that we experience it daily. Out in the hot sun all day working hard, your throat begins to dry out and your tongue feels parched. You try to lick your lips and want a drink. As the sweat drips from your brow, a picture comes to your mind of a tall clear glass of ice water, the ice cubes tinkling invitingly against the inside of the glass and beads of water sparkling on the outside of the glass. You almost tumble over your own feet in your rush inside for a drink of water to refresh your throat, body and mind from the thirst of heat and work.

Water is refreshing.

Water also cleanses us.

After a hard day of backbreaking work, nothing feels quite as good as a long hot shower. To scrub off the sweat and grime is not just to clean the body, but water makes one feel like a new person. We use gallons of water every day to clean our bodies, clothes, dishes, cars and pets.

Water is essential as well.

All creatures require water to live. When the Apollo 13 spacecraft experienced problems in space, the grave concern was not power but the reserve of water that was essential for every operation of the space craft.

Water naturally plays a huge role in the Bible. Hagar and Ishmael would have died in the wilderness without water when their skin of water was used up. The Lord opened Hagar's eyes to find a well of water.

Water became the means through which God saved Noah and his family. God was said to have waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was prepared, in which few were saved through water.

Later, God saved the people of Israel from slavery in Egypt through the water of the Red Sea.

Under the Law of Moses, God required that the priests wash themselves with water before entering the tabernacle in service to God, and failure to do so meant death.

Jesus said to Nicodemus, "Most assuredly, I say unto you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God."

What is truly amazing about water is that the very element which we desperately need and use so much, God has blessed in exceeding abundance in the form of dew, rain, ponds, lakes, creeks, streams, rivers, seas and oceans.

All of this reminds me of God's provision for me. More and more these days, water reminds me of God's abundant care and love.

Session Synopsis of March 19, 2018

Session met on Monday evening, March 19th for conversation and to take action on a few items and talk about the life of the congregation. Pastor Mark moderated the meeting. Highlights:

- Cathy Cole led devotions by reading from her writing and a piece by Doyle Andrews in *First Notes* about reaching out as “helping hands” to be a congregation of connections serving Christ, and closed with prayer.
- Session received numerous reports from work- ing teams, and took the following actions:
 - 1) Approved request from Building and Grounds Team for \$3,000 from capital funds for in-house work on drainage project on the north side of the church building to alleviate degradation of the roof columns.
 - 2) Endorsed application supported by the Mission Team to the presbytery mission committee for funding in support of Syria and Lebanon minis- tries through the Outreach Founda- tion.
 - 3) Approved request to host the Cub Scouts’ Duty to God event on March 22, 2018, in the sanctuary with wor- ship and offering that will include teaching about Presbyterian beliefs and practices; Praise Band will lead congregational singing.
 - 4) Received and approved reports from Pastor, Building and Grounds, Build- ing Disciples, Christian Education, Congregational Life, Endowment, Finance, iEngage, Membership and Session Clerks, Mission and Worship Teams, and minutes of previous meeting.
- Session celebrated multiple stories about the Hunt for 3,400 Easter Eggs that brought togeth- er about 120 children and families, and nearly that many volunteers to our church grounds on Sunday afternoon, March 18th.
- Personnel Ministry Team continues recruiting for one more nursery assistant for Sunday morn- ings.
- Pastor Mark again invited each around the table to talk with Session about what was on his or her heart or mind. Topics discussed matters of congregational life: training new people on the sound system, plans for puppeteers in worship, the LIFT events on Sunday mornings at 10:00 a.m. in April, upcoming mission trips, Sunday morning studies of I and II Timothy, range of channels for inviting the community to worship and events at our church and telling stories of learning something new, i.e. being transformed, and matters of pastoral care.
- Pastor Mark closed by asking each member to live as a voice for how we as Christians treat others and reflect the love Christ has for us. Session closed with circle of prayer at 8:00 p.m.

The next Stated Session meeting is April 16, 2018, at 7:00 p.m. with the Deacons.

That's the short definition from our Worship and Hospitality Team.

I am a new Deacon. Recently, I did my first Sunday as Deacon-on-Call (short job description: greet people Sunday morning and help ushers take the collection).

Greeting first time visitors is a challenge for people like me who are not natural born salesmen. I managed, a little awkwardly, to welcome a visiting couple, get them to the Hospitality Center for a cup of coffee and send a few people over to meet them.

After worship they told me they were not used to our style of worship.

"We have two services," I replied, "with quite different styles of worship. Please come back to see the other service some time soon. We have two pastors as well. It would be good for you to hear both of them."

I didn't forget to give them a visitor bag and I offered a mini-tour of the building if they had time. "Maybe next time," they said.

Not too bad for a beginner I thought. At least I didn't give them a reason to stay away. Did that couple come back? I haven't seen them, but then I attend the service with the worship style they didn't care for.

There are dozens of churches in town and no guarantee anyone will ever come back. All we can do is provide the best possible worship experience we can and offer our hospitality.

If you've read this far I want to encourage you to take a few moments some Sunday morning to seek out visitors. Greet them and find out where they're from. Show them how to get a cup of coffee and share one with them. Treat them in a way that might make them want to come back.

Hospitality is the sum of many small parts, a smile, a handshake, directions around the building, a snack to munch on. These things come naturally to a handful of people in our congregation. But if you're more like me, why not give it a try sometime soon. Hospitality can brighten your day as well as that of a stranger.

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Holy Land Mission Trip

- August 7: Fly. Aug 8: Arrive in Tel Aviv. Visit the port city of Jaffa – St. Peter Church and the story of Peter in the house of Simon the Tanner. Transfer to Jerusalem to the hotel.
- Aug 9: Start the day with a pilgrimage visit to Mount of Olives with a panoramic view over the city of Jerusalem. Walk the Palm Sunday path from the Pater Noster Church to the garden of Gethsemane. Visit the Wailing Wall, the most holy site for the Jews all over the world. Stop at the Israeli museum where you can see the model of Jerusalem at the time of Jesus (Jerusalem second temple period) and the shrine of the book – the place where you can learn about the Dead Sea scrolls. End the day in the village of Ein Karem. See the Church of the Visitation and the birth place of St. John the Baptist.
- Aug 10: Leave Jerusalem towards southern city of Bethlehem (West Bank, Palestinian Authority). Drive through the check point and the separation wall. Visit the monastery of the shepherds fields, where the angel of the Lord appeared to the shepherds announcing the birth of Jesus. Visit the Nativity Church, the birth place of the Lord, and St. Catherine Catholic Church. Mission to Bethlehem University, Bethlehem Bible College and/or Wiam, tour a refugee camp.
- Aug 11: Drive to the wilderness to visit Masada, Herod's most amazing desert fortress. Then drive to Qumran to visit the remains of the settlement and the caves where the Dead Sea scrolls were found. Stop at the Dead Sea for a float in this unique salty lake. (And enjoy a drink at the world's lowest elevation bar, if you want!).
- Aug 12: Early morning start with a walk in Jerusalem in the Old City. Walk the way of the cross and visit the Holy Sepulcher Church. This is the place of the crucifixion and the tomb of our Lord Jesus Christ. Attend the English speaking Sunday worship in the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. Then proceed to Mount Zion to visit the last supper room and the church of St. Peter in Gallicantu.
- Aug 13: Today we concentrate on the Biblical City of Jerusalem and the Temple Mount area. Visit the city of David. Southern steps. Western Wall and the Western Wall tunnel.
- Aug 14: Leave Jerusalem towards the coastal plain and visit the remains of caesarean maritime, Herod's biggest city. The place where Cornelius the centurion met Simon Peter and believed in Christianity. This is also the place where St. Paul was in prison. On the way to the Sea of Galilee, drive through Nazareth and visit the amazing church of the Annunciation. Overnight in Tiberias by the sea.
- Aug 15: Drive to the Golan Heights to visit the biblical city Dan. Enjoy a walk in the natural park and the biblical remains of Dan. Then drive to Caesarea Philippi, the place where Peter declared Jesus as the Son of God. Overnight in Tiberias by the sea.
- Aug 16: Today we will finalize our pilgrimage concentrating on Jesus's public ministry. We will start our day with a worship by the lake near the church of the Multiplication and the story of feeding the five thousand. Then visit the church of St. Peter primacy and Jesus appearing to his disciples. See the remains of Capernaum, Jesus's Galilean headquarters, and the chapel of the Beatitudes. Finalize the day with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Overnight in Tiberias by the sea.

Aug 17: Early check out and transfer to the airport.

Cost: \$2,100 (extra for a single room) + flight (currently running only \$700!)

We will travel around Sao Paulo, Campinas, Valinhos and Sao Jose do Rio Preto visiting with new believers, pastors, recently planted congregations, and established congregations that are starting others. We will worship with brothers and sisters in Christ and learn from some of the leaders of a growing Presbyterian-led church planting movement that includes leaders from several Reformed and evangelical denominations.

- Date of Trip: July 16-26 or 27, 2018
- Cost of Trip: Ground Fees to GEM: \$1,000 (hotel, meals and transportation)
(Application fee, \$150, remaining funds are due in mid-June)
Airfare: Approximately: \$1,200 – \$1,600

- We may be passing out food, helping with paperwork, putting up tents, guarding gates; escorting POC’s, distributing supplies, friendship, listening, etc.

- Team Preparation: Applications and \$150.00 deposit due to Greater Europe Mission by March 14, 2018
