SESSION SYNOPSIS

OF

MARCH 17, 2021

There was definitely a sense of hope in the air at the most recent Session meeting. Many of your Elders have received both doses of the coronavirus vaccine; news of in-person Sunday morning Christian Education opportunities; the resumption of PWNS classes; plans for Palm Sunday and Easter activities; Bell Choir practices; and updated safety and compliance plans all point in the direction of the return to 3401 N. Valparaiso Street and the FPCV campus! What a joy!

In reflecting on an eventual return to in-person worship, various feelings may have arisen. Worship over the past year has definitely been challenging. One elder spoke to their journey they have experienced over this past year and the challenges that it posed. But as our technology skills grew, so did our ability to expand the dimensions of our worship. We were forced to adapt in many ways, and our technology has grown and expanded, and many of us may have gotten quite comfortable with worshipping from home, perhaps even in our pj's! Now our worship is about to change *again*, and this could bring about new stresses in moving forward, because no matter what, things will *never* be quite the way they were before. But Deuteronomy 31:8 provides the hope and support that as hard as change is, we still *need* to be moving forward, knowing that God is on our side always: *Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the Lord will personally go ahead of you. He will be with you; he will neither fail you nor abandon you.* We do know that this has been and will continue to be our reality.

Another highlight of the meeting included updates regarding the Ministry Candidates who fall under the care of both our Session and our Presbytery. We are blessed to have **four** such candidates, three who have covenant relationships to become Ministers of the Word and Sacrament, and one who is working to become a Commissioned Ruling Elder. **Ken Crews** has completed his requirements for ordination. Prayers for Ken as he enters into a time of discernment regarding next steps. **Tim Reyna** is in the process of taking his final tests to qualify him for ordination and is currently serving the First Presbyterian Church in Winfield. **Bill Rogers** has completed all his requirements and is actively seeking a call; he is currently serving consistent pulpit supply and pastoral care for the First Presbyterian Church in Portage. Our fourth candidate is **Ron Phillips** who is enrolled in the Commissioned Ruling Elder (CRE) program. Once he completes this program, he will join CRE's **Mike Becker**, **Lou Ann Karabel**, and **Jacki Phillips** who also are qualified for this ministry. It is quite unusual and very special to have so many members involved in active pastoral service, but we reap the rewards with all that these members contribute to our congregation. Each of these individuals deserves our affirmation but especially those who are currently working to complete what the Holy Spirit has called them to do.

Other business included the following...

- Presbytery has provided a tremendous amount of support, encouragement, resources, and other assistance throughout this year of the pandemic (all funded by *per capita* dollars!)
- Presbytery has a project to reduce medical debt that ties in with the Matthew 25 Initiative to help end systemic poverty
- Elders praying for the community have resulted in cards being written (and greatly appreciated!) and pop-up prayers being offered
- There will be three Confirmands joining the church in May (Andrew Adams, Evie Crews, and Gavin Kukler)
- There will be six graduating seniors honored on Youth Sunday in June (Emma Adams, Lynsey Buehler, Emily Coffin, Owen Crews, Katie Golding, and Hattie Hoham)
- Session approved a change in policy which now provides that a **quorum** for all Session meetings in person or via alternative platforms will be a *majority* of the Ruling Elders in current service on the Session. (This will now require seven of the thirteen current Elders; it had previously been established as 33% or four.)

Closing **Joys and Concerns** included the joy of becoming engaged, many vaccinated members, and prayers for health issues.

If you would like more information, please read the detailed minutes which will be *posted in the glass-enclosed announcement board* in the Hospitality Center once they are approved (and we are allowed back into the church!). **In the meantime**, please contact any of the Elders and/or the Clerk if you have questions or are interested in further details.
