CHANCEL VISIONING TEAM

Our session has contracted with Erich Thompson – Sacred Spaces to create a unique suite of chancel furniture for our worship space. These rough sketches show the designs, noting that further fine-tuning is expected as his work moves forward. The red and blue are placeholders for art glass to be created by our local artists at Hot Shop Valpo. The suite includes the pulpit, large communion table, hanging cross resized but similar to the current mounted cross, a baptismal font, plus small lectern and two pairs of higher and lower side tables as needed for flowers, Christ candle, baptismal oil and pitcher, and the like. Finance account 8-206: Sacred Space and its gifts of \$5,000 are committed to this project. The congregation and its friends are invited to contribute to this account for the chancel furniture. This suite is outside the current budget and other reserve funds, therefore will be funded with dedicated gifts. Down payment of \$13,800 will accompany the signed contract when returned on an expected contract price of \$34,500 for all pieces. Anticipated delivery time is late summer.

WHY DO THIS NOW?

Are we a vibrant congregation today, proficient in the technology for streaming our worship services, faith formation classes and other events into homes? Are we vibrantly alive with music that includes ancient bells and guitars, piano and organ, bongos and snares, classical solos and swinging choir anthems? Are young children wiggling and coloring at our PrayGround table? Are there preschoolers eager to enter the building on Monday mornings? Do dynamic leaders preach the Word that illustrates and challenges us to live as Christ would have us live in today's challenging world? Do we sponsor Pop-up missions that serve immediate needs in our community? That's who we are, and so much more.

What does our current chancel space show about us with its mix of "70's Modern" pieces and old traditional pieces? What does our worshipping community see, whether in the sanctuary or newcomers online? A missing pulpit replaced by a lectern pulled from storage...cracked baptismal font holding water we cannot see...odds and ends to hold the Christ candle, baptismal pitcher, the large Bible, flowers as offerings...



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CHANCEL VISIONING TEAM, CONTINUED

Will theologically designed chancel furniture enhance our worship with symbols and colors of our faith? Will pleasing, quality pieces in our chancel attract new attention to the Word, experiences of the waters of baptism and the Lord's Supper at the communion table, and the Celtic cross above us with its infinite circle reminding us of God's unending love?

The Chancel Visioning Team and Session say "Yes!" to these questions. Working with Erich Thompson, a Presbyterian pastor whose ministry is working with congregations to envision furniture for worship space, we intentionally chose to design theologically rather than "match" the architecture design. Together we developed a suite of related pieces: chancel furniture that was moveable, echoing core design details yet each with a theological message. Water will be visible in the font with clear glass that suggests the presence of the Holy Spirit in waters of baptism. The Word will be read and spoken from a centered place of prominence that suggests God as Creator. The Table is rounded to be inclusive and on the floor with the people. Both the Table and the rescaled and rebuilt cross above the chancel will remind us of the gifts of Christ through bread and wine, and His resurrection. Five auxiliary pieces will be used as needed.

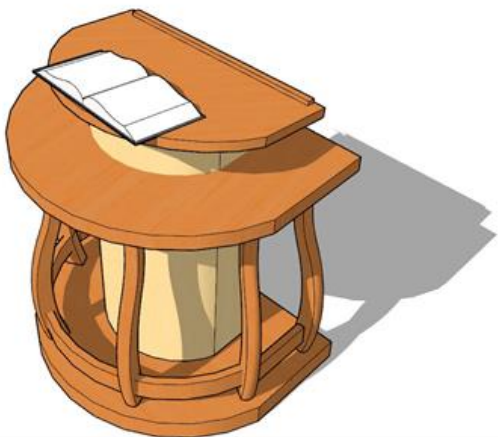
The pieces are designed to accommodate our paraments patterned after our art glass windows that illustrate God's presence throughout scripture. They provide creative flexibility and are meaningful in our current chancel as well as in potential future chancel renovations. Now is the right time to set aside our mismatched furniture from the 70's (or before) and embrace beauty with fresh symbols enhancing worship in the chancel. The artisan-crafted chancel furniture is a special project for us – conceived through many Zoom and masked meetings during two years of pandemic disruption – both to celebrate the church we are today and to inspire those worshipping as the church of tomorrow.

The chancel furniture will get us started toward overall church building renovations. It's doable immediately through dedicated gifts, memorials and other new funding for something beautiful that will renew our attention in our worship space. This bold leap of faith may inspire and energize us to move forward with a longer term capital campaign for our building to support new ministry and refreshed visibility in our community as a vibrant congregation in the 21st century.

SCOPE OF WORK:

The B+G's Team works daily, throughout the year, maintaining First Presbyterian Church, Classrooms, Meeting Rooms, Pavilion and Grounds so as to provide a safe, comfortable and beautiful environment for our Faith Communities Worship, Education and Celebrations.

1973 CONSTRUCTION AND DEDICATION

We strive to keep up with preventative maintenance and/or repair critical infrastructure, winter, spring, summer & fall, of our physical facility and grounds with local contractors and Congregational Volunteers.

This is not always an easy task considering our original facility, which includes the Sanctuary, Sacristy, Fellowship Hall (gym), Kitchen and the original North & West Hallway Classrooms are now 49 years old constructed in 1973. The South hallway, Small Groups & Presbys' rooms, Friendship Room, PWNS office & Classrooms, the Nursery, our Hospitality Center and Office additions were constructed in 1999, now 22½ years old.

MATTHEW 25 REFLECTION



“MATTHEW 25 REFLECTION” presents information chosen by our Matthew 25 Team to inform and inspire our church family to actively engage in activities and with initiatives that reduce poverty and racism in our local communities and beyond.

Most of us believe we are not racist. We feel that we treat people of color with kindness and respect. We **easily recognize** and speak out against **racist individuals** who act out through cross burning, hate crimes, or racist rhetoric.

However, we **do not easily recognize** the **structural racism** that is woven into every aspect of society. Structural Racism is the many racial inequalities that result from American systems and policies that we have always accepted without question.

The best way to gain an understanding of Structural Racism is by looking at the inequalities it produces. Having previously examined inequalities of **wealth, education, and housing**, this month we continue by looking at the vast inequalities in **Health Care and Employment**.

Healthcare

- A. Infant mortality for black people is more than double the rate for white people.
- B. Life expectancy at birth: on average white people live 4 years longer.
- C. Cancer death rate per 100,000 – Men: 233.5 for African Americans vs 197.3 for white people. Women: 156.0 for African Americans vs 141.9 for white people. These disparities exist for most chronic conditions including obesity, diabetes, high blood pressure and asthma for African Americans, Latinos, and Native Americans compared to white people.
- D. As of May 6, Covid-19 deaths recorded in Chicago showed the death rate for black people was 3½ x the death rate for white people. Similar results in most states.
- E. Research indicates that across virtually every type of diagnostic and treatment intervention **black people and other minorities receive fewer procedures and poorer-quality medical care than do white people.**
- F. Due to low wage jobs with no benefits, high unemployment, and living in economically depressed neighborhoods, **black people have large numbers of uninsured and less access to vital medical care** that most of us take for granted.

Employment

- A. Black persons unemployment rate has been 2x that of white persons for 60 years, no matter what has been going on in the economy.
- B. Black people with college degrees are 2x more likely to be unemployed than other graduates.
- C. Job applicants with white-sounding names get called back about 50% more often than applicants with black-sounding names.
- D. A vast majority of employment decision-makers are white. **White people find 70% of their jobs through an inside recommendation offered by a family member or friend.**

As we read, study, and discuss Matthew 25 issues, we need God’s help in fully recognizing the injustice and inequality that continue to exist because of systemic poverty and structural racism. Please add your voice daily in asking that God guide us and empower us, individually and as a church family, in our Matthew 25 efforts. We also need His help in finding meaningful ways for us to act in response to our love and concern.

Prayer in response to today’s article:

Lord, lead and direct my thoughts as I reflect upon the inequalities in health care and employment within our nation. Amen.

FINANCIAL REPORT JANUARY THROUGH MID-APRIL 2022

Vibrant congregations give generously from heartfelt gratitude for the gifts they have received. This is our stewardship witness – what we have done – from January 1 through mid-April:

- Total operating & capital income was \$152,045 or 36% of our budgeted income
- Total operating & capital expenses were \$154,455 and 31% of budgeted expenses
- This puts us \$2,409 behind for now.

In addition to operating and capital giving, this year through the middle of April we received \$44,000 in special donations and distributed \$42,000. Some of those major gifts were for mission and outreach: \$2,130 for the bikes/helmets/locks awards to the Beveridge students; \$2,248 for Christmas Joy offering; \$1,615 for CWS blankets; \$1,110 in 2nd Mile offering gifts for Hilltop Neighborhood House and its pantry; \$3,255 to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance; and \$2,095 for One Great Hour of Sharing. Our net temporarily restricted accounts rose \$1,900 by mid-April.

This is money for ministry that brings us:

- Gifted preachers and teachers of the Word and talented staff that lead and support our ministry teams, whether with music, bookkeeping, planning or administrative tasks;
- Guest musicians to enrich our worship services;
- Website, Facebook, emails and streaming to reach shut-ins, medically vulnerable people, wanders seeking a church move, our own members in need of information;
- Zoom to share adult faith formation classes to people at home and get-work-done meetings;
- Arts and crafts to keep young hands engaged and to add images, texture, flight of fancy to our worship space;
- Space to share with community singers, serve as collection site for camp needs, provide a week-day nursery, host Scouts and so much more.
