SESSION SYNOPSIS OF APRIL 24, 2024

The highlight of this Session meeting was Johnny Lawson presenting himself for confirmation as a member of our church. Johnny has completed his confirmation class, taught by Pastor Kim and Mentor Jerry Kahrs, and he shared his Statement of Faith which covered most of the topics he had studied during the twelve sessions. Elders were pleased and impressed with Johnny's statement and very proud of the growth and maturity he has displayed. After conversation, a **motion** was made, seconded, and enthusiastically approved to arrest the examination and welcome Johnny as our newest member of FPC Valpo. He will be welcomed publicly on May 19 when he will share his statement of faith with the congregation. Elders and Johnny's family then all enjoyed a delicious working pizza dinner.

Several noteworthy discussions occurred:

- Facilities Use & Policies ~ This document was approved by Session in March, but several concerns about its complexity and some unintended additional work for office staff as well as application to church members resulted in the Bylaws/Polity Task Force recommending that parts of the policy be reconsidered. **Motion** was made, seconded, and approved to delay implementing the policy with respect to church members but still be used with non-church members and outside groups, at least until further revision can be discussed. The policy will revert to the previous status concerning church members.
- Worship Team is developing guidelines for decision-making regarding relocation of outdoor pavilion services in inclement weather. These should be ready for adoption at the May meeting.
- iEngage Team is actively working to revamp and update the church website. Details will be made available and input is encouraged.

Five additional **motions** were presented:

- **Blanket Motion** to give all Staff voice but no vote at all Session meetings moving forward (approved)
- **Treasurer/Finance Motion** to increase the Planned Giving Committee's recommendation to increase the amount received from the Porter County Community Foundation for the Graeber Scholarship from the \$1,000 (which was approved by Session in March) to \$1,250 which is the actual amount available for distribution this year. (approved)
- **Faith Formation Team Motion** for Vacation Bible Camp to collect backpacks & supplies to be dispersed to as many Valparaiso Community Schools as possible for the 2024-2025 school year as their mission giving project (approved)
- **Mission Team Motion** for a bike drive with bicycles and equipment (for 8-9-year-olds) to be distributed in early May to students at Williams Elementary School in Gary (approved)
- **Worship Team Amended Motion** to give Ken Medema permission to make his music available for purchase following a concert (date TBD) (approved)

Gretchen Seidler-Gibbs. She has served on the Board of Directors of the Covenant Network of Presbyterians since January, 2015.

This initial gathering will be complemented by a sermon series, an examination of a wide variety of diversity trends, monthly discussions based on readings, videos and Bible studies, and culminate in identifying further priorities and plans to help us become a more inclusive and welcoming congregation. We invite all of you to join these open, honest and respectful conversations.

PRESCHOOL PLANNING TEAM NEWS

UPDATE FROM PRESCHOOL PLANNING TEAM

Since being created by Session at its 11.29.23 Meeting, and with its charter: *“This Planning Team will explore options as to how our church could serve children and families in our community. The Planning Team to envision and propose a plan for a Matthew 25-oriented project to be funded by seed money from the Sharing Table Project”* the Team, consisting of Paul Knauff, Doug Hollar, Cathy Cole, Cathy Greenawald, Lisa Pavlopoulos, Karen Hahn (a knowledgeable preschool resource in Bloomington, IN), Harry Karabel and Jim Hubbard have been meeting every two weeks on Tuesday afternoon via Google Meet to do their due diligence and to move forward with their exploration.

One of the Team’s initial tasks has been to finalize a recommendation to Session as to how the Governing Team for the existing Preschool can be structured in a manner similar to how the Presbyterian Resale Shop operates, including having a set of Policies & Procedures and a leadership selection process with term lengths in place. Session will have final approval and then this Preschool Governance Team will be put in place to guide the current Preschool as it lives out its role.

The Planning Team is approaching its task by (a) examining our ‘present state’ of what our Preschool offers and whom we are enrolling, (b) what else is available in the area, i.e. what are other Preschools offering and whom do they serve, and (c) identifying the unmet needs in the community, not just at the Preschool level but considering also childcare needs that may exist for working families, and evaluating what it might take for our church and its facilities to help in fulfilling those needs.

What our Preschool is doing now has been confirmed. However, gathering the information about what others are offering and what the needs are is proving to be a bit harder than originally anticipated. The last piece, being the evaluating of what it would take to move beyond where our Preschool is today, and what possibly offering childcare services would entail, looks to be a formidable undertaking with the many and varied State requirements for these Early Learning Initiative activities with regard to both program offerings and physical space & staffing requirements.

The Planning Team is motivated and is committed to doing its work as timely as possible and will report to the congregation on a periodic basis.

FIRST PRESBYTERIAN PRESCHOOL NEWS

PWNS has a NEW name. With Session approval our preschool is now known as First Presbyterian Preschool (FPP). After 47 successful years, it was felt that the “nursery” term in PWNS was no longer appropriate so thus the name change. Please look for the name change in our NEW signs promoting the preschool in the front yard of the church. Also, thanks to Jerry Kahrs and Jim Hubbard, the FPP now has a NEW video promoting our preschool on the website. Check it out; it is awesome.

May is the Second Mile offering dedicated to FPP. A huge thank you for the generosity of all those church members and friends who have supported FPP in the past. FPP operates as a self-sustaining ministry of our church, and we are forever grateful for our members’ support. Did you know that FPP has a scholarship fund? The Aid-en Carter Harris Scholarship Fund supports families with monthly tuition when financial challenges become difficult.

With the leadership of our director, Dana Hanson, teacher, Lisa Koroncz, and teacher assistant, Megan Nelson, FPP has had a great year. Seventeen Pre-K students and 10 Early Learners have grown so much because of the leadership of this team. March brought a Night with the Author and the successful annual Read-a-Thon to FPP. The VI-Pizza Night was celebrated in April along with an FPP Open House for interested families. May will bring the annual trip to the Bus Barn for the Pre-K class as they make the transition to Kindergarten, and Pre-K Celebration will follow on May 28. A summer school program will be offered for Pre-K students from 9:00-11:00a.m. the week of July 29 to August 2. If you have a preschooler or know of someone interested, enrollment is now underway for both the summer program and the 2024-25 school year. 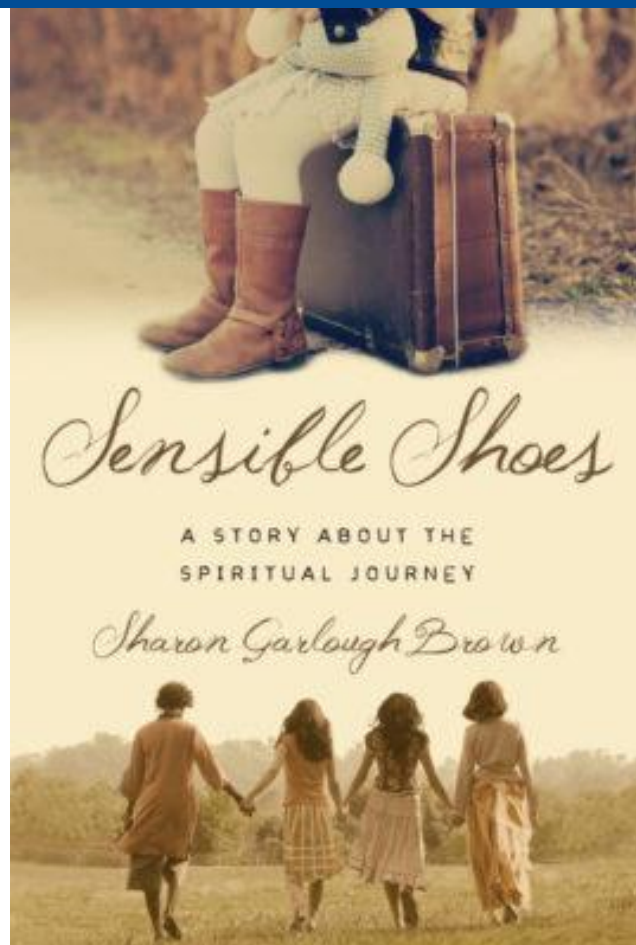

PARISH NURSE NEWS

RED CROSS DONOR SPOTLIGHT



Raymond Swadley, 85, made his first blood donation in 1958 when a co-worker asked him to join him in giving. He's been donating regularly ever since.

"When you get started, you do not realize what a wonderful service you are doing for people," Raymond said. "When I got my first pin for donating a gallon of blood, it sort of became an obsession."

In 65 years of donating, Raymond has given 346 units of blood and seen the process evolve drastically. While giving in the Army, he recalls the glass bottles and rubber tubes used in collections. Today, he schedules his appointments online and gets an email telling him where his blood ends up.

"I hope to keep giving as long as my health is good," he said. "I've never suffered any ill effects, and it doesn't hurt as bad as stubbing your toe."

Donating blood, as well as other volunteer work for the Red Cross, has become a significant part of Raymond's life. He has a scrapbook with his donor cards, letters and notes he's received from the Red Cross.

"When I look back on what I have done that has been worthwhile, I think donating blood may be near the top of the list," he said. "Hopefully, people who read this will think so too."

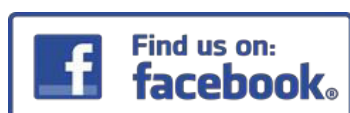
