SESSION SYNOPSIS OF JUNE 17, 2019

There is cause for celebration! Elders welcomed and examined **RYNE PRESS**, **PAT HAAS**, and **JOHN HAAS**, three prospective new members who have requested joining our congregation. After introducing themselves and sharing their backgrounds and faith journeys, Pastor Nancy Becker asked them several questions required by the Book of Order. Session enthusiastically approved them as members, and they will be “officially” introduced on Sunday, June 30. Pat stated that this was the most welcoming church she has ever been in! Everyone can be extremely proud that, even in times of transition without a pastor, we continue to spread the Good News to all who enter our doors!

Session was presented and approved two timelines for the next several months. First, the **CONGREGATIONAL NOMINATING COMMITTEE** is beginning its work to select candidates for the offices of Elder, Deacon, and Youth Deacon. It is an exciting time to serve the church with the probability of a new pastor coming on board in the near future, so if you are contacted by a member of the committee, please prayerfully consider answering the call of the Holy Spirit to further the mission of FPC Valpo. Second, the **STEWARDSHIP TEAM** is beginning preparations for their upcoming campaign to determine the 2020 budget. You will find more information in the August *Tidings*, with all activities culminating in **CELEBRATION SUNDAY** on September 22. Session approved having a single service for September 22 at 10:00 a.m. followed by a brunch.

Session is quite proud of ALL the Ministry Candidates under our care. Our three candidates for Ordination of the Word and Sacrament (Ken Crews, Tim Reyna, and Bill Rogers) have nearly completed all their requirements, and Jacki Phillips has graduated from the CRE (Commissioned Ruling Elder)

Program. We will continue to support these individuals, encourage their efforts in all future endeavors, and most certainly keep them in our prayers. Be sure to congratulate them when you see them!

There was also quite a lot of business requiring action:

- **BUILDING & GROUNDS** proposals that were approved:
 - Indiana Dunes Great Banquet has requested the use of portions of the church (primarily the gym, kitchen, Friendship Room, two or three classrooms) from September 26-29 and October 3-6 for their fall weekends in the even that Camp Lawrence (their usual venue) is still unavailable. Any usage conflicts will be resolved by B & G. Part of the rationale for approval was the observation that this would be an excellent opportunity for FPC to show radical hospitality to a community which has had a huge impact on many members of our congregation!
 - Adopt-a-Plot (designating specific areas around the church in need of landscaping maintenance to be cared for by individuals, families, small groups, teams, etc.). Information will be available and places to sign up will be in the Narthex.
 - Quality Alarm proposal to update the smoke alarm system throughout the church
 - Controlled Comfort proposal to repair and update the AC system

HILLTOP NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSE NEWS



Volunteers needed! Hilltop Neighborhood House is a community center that operates an early childhood education program for children birth through 5 years, a free afterschool tutoring program, and a food pantry. Our mission is to empower the community by providing a place to learn, grow and belong.

We have three areas of need at Hilltop; classroom volunteers, front desk volunteers and food pantry volunteers. Below are the job descriptions for each area.

CLASSROOM VOLUNTEERS

Following the guidance and direct supervision of the classroom lead and assistant teachers, volunteers assist with providing a safe, nurturing environment that caters to the academic, social, and cognitive development of children in their care. Volunteers are not counted in child/staff ratio and are never left alone with children.

FRONT DESK VOLUNTEERS

Serve parents, guardians, staff, work study students, volunteers and visitors by greeting, welcoming, and directing them appropriately; notifies Hilltop personnel of visitor arrivals and phone calls and messages; maintains security and policies, and telecommunications system.

FOOD PANTRY VOLUNTEERS

Serve pantry clients, work alongside volunteers to greet, welcome, and direct pantry clients appropriately; stock shelves; maintain a safe environment; document deliveries/donations; clean and clear out delivery boxes and other miscellaneous items.

GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP NEWS

On September 21 through September 28, 2019, six of us from First Presbyterian Church will join four others to travel to Oasis, San Lucas Guatemala. The purpose of our mission trip is to care for the caregivers. We will meet and nurture the “Tias” (or Housemothers) who administer to and pour love onto the very young and traumatized victims of abuse. These Tias work ten days on, four days off and some take a bus for seven hours one way to come work at Oasis. Often, they spend more time with the girls at Oasis than with their own families. They do this because they believe they are called by our Lord to do as he taught - to love one another as He loves us. We will share God’s love with these ladies and remind them how incredibly treasured they are.

We appreciated the love and support that our church has given to us. We are leading a Bible study with the Tias every day in the morning. The afternoons are times for us to share God’s love through relaxing arts and crafts, snacks and sharing stories.

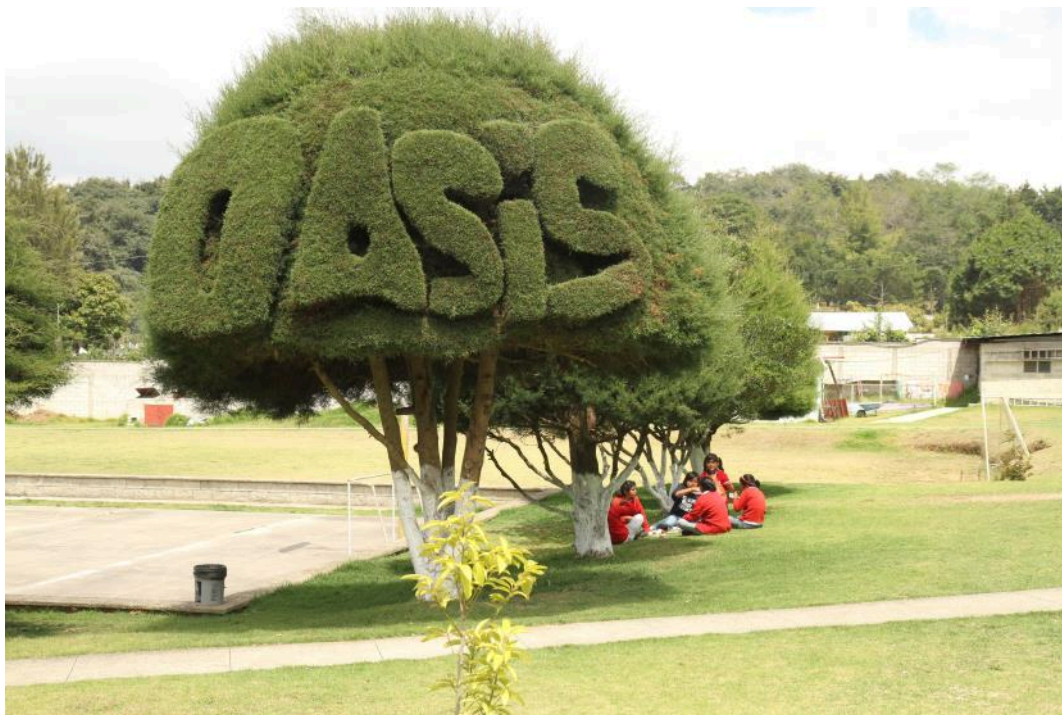
We are asking you to be part of this mission trip by providing prayers as we work as a team preparing and while we are in Guatemala.

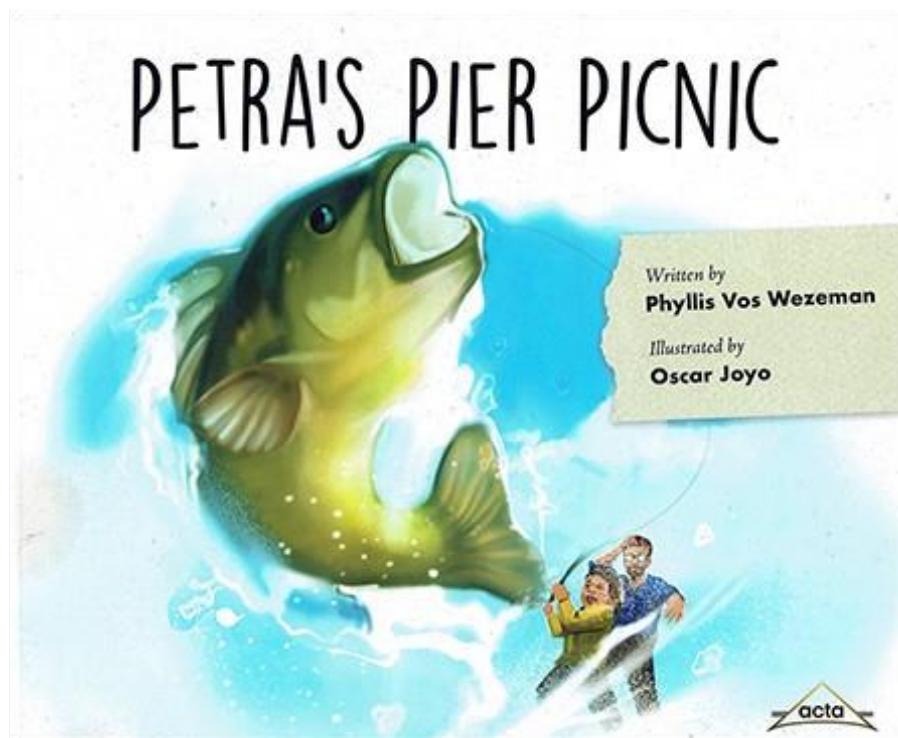

CHRISTIAN FOOD PANTRY

In May, the pantry served two hundred and forty-two families providing food for five hundred and ninety-nine people. The 223 postal boxes of food we received from the postal workers drive filled the shelves and more items were donated by those attending the Memorial Day concert at the Opera House.
