SESSION SYNOPSIS OF JUNE 14, 2023

Session began this month with the same sense of excitement and vitality which has been permeating the church all spring as Elders received an update on The Sharing Table Project from Jim Hubbard, co-chair. The astounding responses from the congregation will allow us to realize much of the vision set forth in March for FPC Valpo. Session now has the responsibility to set priorities for how these bountiful gifts will be distributed. As was stated in a recent bulletin under Glimpses of Vibrancy, we can “prepare for new missions, revitalize ministries, reach further into our community, and provide the resources it takes to share God’s love and sustain Christ’s work in this place.”

Historically, Session does not meet in July, so Elders conducted a great deal of business with much thoughtful discussion. Action was taken on many items; the following **motions** were all **approved**:

- **Building & Grounds** received approval to have Timberseal clean black ceiling mold staining, retreat, and reseal the Pavilion ceiling.
- **Presbytery of Wabash Valley** has asked FPC Valpo to host its September 30 Assembly meeting and picnic. The picnic will be open to the entire Presbytery and prepared and run by a team from Presbytery, with hosting help from Jeff Whitney, Trish Lawson, Congregational Life and Debra Daugherty.
- **Faith Formation** will be holding a concert by Danen Kane on August 12, 2023, in the Sanctuary with donations designated for the Caring Place.
- An email motion on May 26, 2023, following a 24-hour discussion period, to adopt the revised Operational Policies and Procedures document for the Presbyterian Women’s Resale Shop.
- Accepted the following slate of officers for the Presbyterian Women’s Resale Shop selected at the Administrative Commission’s meeting of June 13, 2023:

- Ken McAloon is stepping back from AC duties. Jim Hubbard was elected to the Administrative Commission in his place.
- **Finance:**
 - ◆ Move \$2,000 in Pavilion Maintenance Fund 30290 to Capital Pavilions designated fund 2-10511.
 - ◆ Add 10020 as cash account to Chart of Accounts for new Horizon Checking.
 - ◆ Transition asap the 1st Source accounts to established Horizon Checking.
 - ◆ Close 1st Source Endowment Checking, transfer \$100 distribution balance to general funds (PCCF checks come directly to the church).
 - ◆ Invest The Sharing Table Project funds 40015 as received; Session-designated accounting including investments but no separate checking account.

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- ♦ Reserve \$27,000 from redeemed PILP CD (May) for known additional expenses beyond budget and Smock/ADA project (additional \$30,000 was approved by Session in 2022 as a match for the Smock grant)
- ♦ Remove Presbyterian Women Resale Shop entries from Realm – not auditable; use only Stocks reimbursements received and mission disbursements in reports
- ♦ Invest reserve funds in higher interest rate/short term CDs after considering cash flow needs
- ♦ Set aside \$5,000 for attorney fees to be reimbursed by the PWRS overhead funds to implement PWRS governance by Session (Historically PWRS allocation has been 50% for mission, 50% for expenses).

Two groups will work to (1) simplify the comprehensive document covering use of our facilities and fees and (2) formulate a more far-reaching plan to address the HVAC issues in the narthex/hospitality center and the boiler in the chapel. Hopefully, Elders will be able to meet over the summer for conversation about these on-going concerns despite not officially meeting again until August.

Reports were received from the Treasurer; Clerk; Pastor Kim; Pastor Ken; Building & Grounds; Congregational Life; Deacons; Director of Worship Music & Digital Technology; Faith Formation (PWNS has hired a coordinator); Membership; Stewardship (including their fall calendar); Worship; and the Congregational Nominating Committee. Moderators were asked to begin reviewing their budget needs for 2024 during August team meetings so that requests can be submitted by September 1 to the Finance Team who will then begin drafting next year's budget.

And as always, Joys and Concerns were shared:

- Upcoming Vacation Bible Camp, the volunteers and especially the campers.
- One elder's spouse is healing from surgery while another's is scheduled for surgery later this month.
- Pastor Kim will be traveling to Montreat for a two-week music conference that she has been working on for three years.
- Having a mother-in-law visit has been a joy as are visits from children and grandchildren, and heading off to visit families who are far away.
- The honor of being invited to present as well as participate in a special Carnegie Hall gathering in New York City in late July is exciting and rewarding.
- Many special prayers for the work of the Administrative Commission and the Presbyterian Resale Shop, for wisdom and grace as church and legal matters are addressed, moving in the right direction, love for the Shop and its ministry over the years (those who volunteer as well as those who shop there).

If you would like more information, please read the detailed minutes which will be *posted in the glass-enclosed announcement board* in the Hospitality Center once they are approved. **In the meantime**, please contact any of the Elders and/or the Clerk if you have questions or are interested in further details.

WHAT EXACTLY IS A PLANNED GIFT?

Most of us are familiar with the idea of committing a portion of our annual income to God's work through our beloved faith community. After we thoughtfully make that decision, the giving process becomes a relatively simple one of writing checks, dropping money in the offering plate or establishing an online transfer from our checking accounts.

By contrast, a **Planned Gift** may need a bit more well *planning*. This is because Planned Gifts (*Special* or *Legacy Gifts*) are generally given from accumulated assets, are over and above our regular annual giving and require us to decide on the best financial way to make such a gift along with how we wish for it to be used.

Ways of Making a Planned Gift

There are a number of ways to financially structure a gift to First Presbyterian for ease and/or maximum impact. Here are a few.

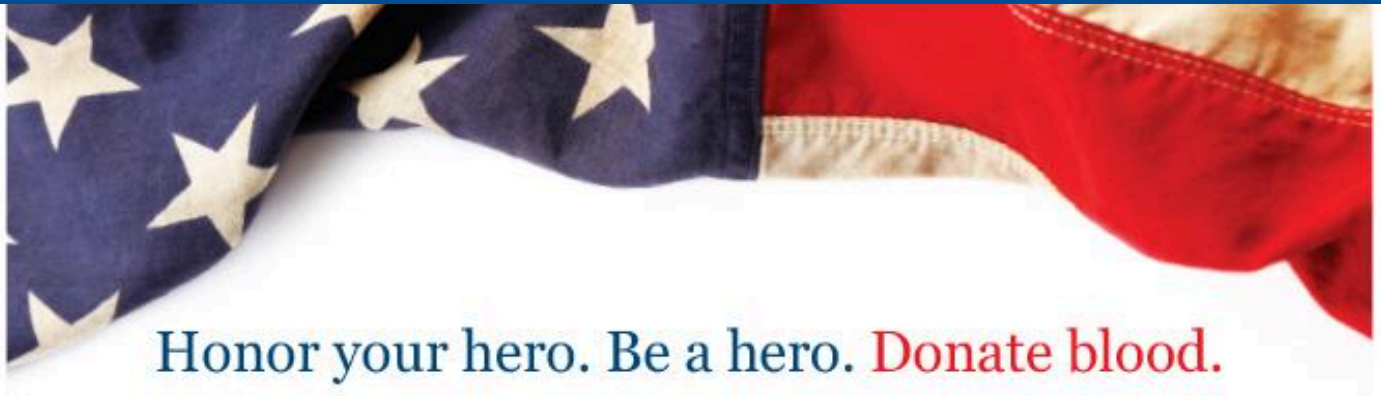
- ♦ **Cash** is truly the easiest and most popular way to make a Planned Gift.
- ♦ **Creating/Updating Your Will** to include First Presbyterian Church as a recipient for a cash bequest; a percentage of your estate; or as a *beneficiary* of specific asset/s is also relatively easy.
- ♦ **Directly transferring Appreciated Investments** (stocks, bonds, mutual funds, etc.); **cash from an IRA**; or **Agricultural Commodities** (if you are in the Farming Business) to the Church can make it possible for you to avoid capital gains tax and/or income tax. The Church will then receive the *full market value* of the gift since it will not be required to pay capital gains on any gifted investments or commodities it liquidates.
- ♦ **Life Insurance and Charitable Trusts** can provide several unique, tax efficient ways to make gifts to the Church both during your lifetime or after. And while Trusts are more detailed instruments, for some families they can be excellent ways of providing support to loved ones as well as a beloved charity.
- ♦ **Donating Readily Marketable Real Estate** that has acquired sizable capital gains can make an excellent gift. You may receive a charitable income tax deduction for the appraised value of the property and the Church can liquidate the property for the *full market value* avoiding the capital gains tax you would have been subject to as the seller.

Deciding How a Gift Is Used (Directing your gift)

Giving to **The Sharing Table Project** or **directly to the Church without restrictions** provides First Presbyterian the flexibility to use your gift where the need is greatest ensuring the usefulness of your gift as needs and times change.

With careful thought, choosing a more specific way of directing your gift will also richly bless First Presbyterian.

**RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE
RECIPIENT SPOTLIGHT**



In 2020, Mikie G. was in a serious vehicle accident. In the first 24 hours of his emergency care, he needed 32 units of blood. In total, he needed 64 units throughout his treatment.

Three years later, Mikie is continuing his recovery. As a thank-you to the donors who provided the blood that saved his life, Mikie and his family hosted a blood drive in his name this year on the anniversary of his accident. They chose that day to turn it from a terrible memory to a life-changing day offering hope and healing to hospital patients in need of blood products.

Thanks to the family and friends who rolled up their sleeves, the blood drive collected 55 units, reaching 138% of goal. Out of the 53 eligible blood donors, 31 were first-time blood donors.

Mikie and his family will continue to raise awareness about the importance of blood donations by making their lifesaving blood drive an annual event and have already scheduled next year's drive.





“Matthew 25 Reflection” presents information chosen by our Matthew 25 Team to inform and inspire our church family to actively engage in activities and with initiatives that reduce poverty and racism in our local communities and beyond.

What can you, as one individual Christian, do to promote equity and fight racism?

1. Speak up when someone is making racist or biased comments. Let them know it offends you. When appropriate, ask them why they feel that way. Relate why you feel (or have come to feel) differently.
2. Keep expanding your knowledge of the history of systemic racism in the United States to better understand how we got to where we are today. Share this understanding with others.
3. Look inside yourself for hidden biases. Take the test at www.learningforjustice.org/hidden-bias. Find opportunities to interact and work with black people in order to reduce the fear and misunderstanding that is responsible for any biased thoughts and impressions you may have.
4. Reflect on why life is not “a level playing field” for all. Think of all the “privileges” that you personally have had access to throughout your life. Help educate others about “white privilege.” Help them to identify examples in their lives and to see how each of these “privileges” helped them move another step up above their black classmates, co-workers, or job applicants.

PRAYER: Dear Heavenly Father, help me to create opportunities and to be aware of opportunities you create for me to help others better understand systemic racism and their role in it. I ask for your guidance in these moments that my words may reflect your love and compassion for all. Amen.

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KENYA REAL

This is what we have been waiting for! This is what you have been praying for! This is what you have given so graciously towards!!

Ask me seven months ago if this would happen and I would have laughed and said, “I wish!”

Calvary Hope School is in the fourth largest slum in Kenya. Our 289 students walk from their homes that have no access to water and electricity. The opportunities are seemingly limited in improving their lives.

And then God works through you! And you go on to give and care about these precious children’s lives and their future!

The opportunities are opened. Their minds expanded!

We started with prayers and “kidogo kidogo” (*little by little*) ground broke, workers chipped away at stone, dust and sand turned into cement. A day at a time, a safe, well lit room was built. Desks were made and men and women workers earned money to support their families.

You showed love and look what you’ve done, by the grace of God!

Twice a week, our students starting in the Third Grade, get to experience this blessing. Never have they ever been in front of a computer. Now, Teacher Dennis is teaching them the basics of typing, italicizing, formatting, HTML, listing in order, and basic web design will follow. There is no WiFi so as not to be interrupted by games (that may be more fun!) or dangerous sites.

These are skills that will help to advance their learning and future! Computers are not going away and things are constantly changing. Now, our students who are marginalized, somewhat stuck, and sometimes a victim of their circumstances, have a boost.

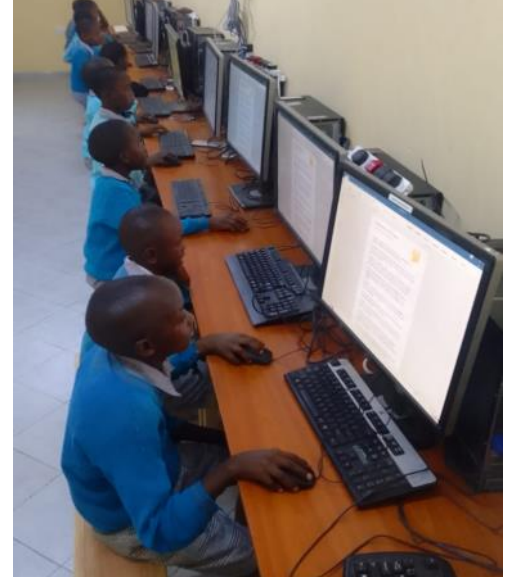

TREASURER'S UPDATE THROUGH MID-JUNE 2023

First Presbyterian Church lives as a vibrant , welcoming congregation with generosity to support our giving for missions, for our ministry teams that support worship, faith formation, maintenance and repairs for our building, and for our staff that leads us in mission and ministry!

- The Sharing Table Project commitments exceeded our own expectations, giving us opportunity to turn our vision of the past few years into specific plans for the future of our ministry.
- Our part-time Faith Formation Coordinator and the Faith Formation Ministry Team are leading us this summer to think about “Joy,” follow the travels of “Flat-Jesus” with our members, welcome Danen Kane for a concert of Christian music, and plan new studies and experiences for all of us to grow in faith this fall.
- While we worship outside this summer, the Buildings & Grounds team is scheduling maintenance and repairs on the Pavilion, cleaning flooring throughout the church building, installing accessible-doors, water fountains and fire-resistant ceiling tiles, and handling the care of our landscaping.
- Lively worship continues during the summer with various voices and instruments, and colorful art continues to direct our attention to God’s Word – including the story of Daniel with the Hanging Gardens of Babylon during Vacation Bible Camp.

Through mid-June this year (five and a half months), we received \$299,821 toward our pledged budget of \$445,572 – plus another \$26,000 in two unexpected planned gifts – one from a will, the other from a new fund established with Porter County Community Foundation. In addition, we received designated funds totaling \$78,451. Total revenue as of June 15th is \$404,273.

So far year-to-date, budgeted expenses paid are \$242,649 for operations and budgeted mission, and donor-designated mission distributions total \$15,360 including \$1,430 for Kenya Real in May, plus mission giving from the Presbyterian Women Resale Shop of approximately \$35,000. Currently we are about \$64,000 ahead of where we were January 1 with our general operating and designated funds, our capital account and our investments.

We give from gratitude for God’s generous blessings, centered around the gift of the Risen Christ – and share in worship and ministry because we live as a vibrant congregation, one that lives God’s Message through what we say and do. That’s who we are together as a beloved community of believers.
