SURPRISING WAYS TO MAKE A CHARITABLE GIFT THROUGH LIFE INSURANCE!

ARTICLE HIGHLIGHTS: Did you know that by giving a no longer needed **whole** life insurance policy to First Presbyterian and making it the owner and beneficiary you may receive a tax deduction for the cash value on your federal income tax, and, if you continue to pay future premiums you may be able to take future deductions. Also, if you purchase a **new** life insurance policy and make the Church both owner and beneficiary and make premium payments through the Church, you may receive a tax deduction each year.

THE DETAILS

Giving life insurance may offer you benefits and a chance to make a special gift to First Presbyterian when other options are not currently feasible. Perhaps you have a policy that is no longer needed or for which the purpose intended no longer exists. The following are several ways an ordinary (whole) life insurance policy can be used to make a charitable gift.

1. Naming First Presbyterian Church as a beneficiary on an existing life insurance policy

This would be part of a will or estate plan and is an easy and direct way to ensure a legacy gift to First Presbyterian through the proceeds received from the policy.

2. Transferring ownership of a policy to First Presbyterian

By transferring ownership and beneficiary status of a no longer needed policy, you may be able to claim a charitable deduction for the *cash value* of the policy. If the policy is not fully paid up and you choose to make the premium payments through the Church, you may be able to take future deductions. To access the benefits from your gift, the Church may surrender the policy for its current cash value; hold it until its face value can be fully realized or even take out a loan against its cash value; among other options.

3. Purchasing a new policy in order to make a charitable gift

It is possible to purchase a whole life insurance policy *for the purpose of transferring ownership and beneficiary status* to First Presbyterian while personally continuing to pay the premiums. You may choose to pay all the premiums or a portion of the premiums and, may be able to declare your premium payments as tax deductible gifts. As in item number two above, the Church has a variety of options for responding to and even maximizing the financial return from such a gift.

Your gifts to First Presbyterian, including gifts funded through life insurance, are always welcome and deeply appreciated. **In all cases, however, we urge you to speak with your tax advisor, estate attorney and/or financial advisor before taking any steps that alter your personal finances.**

BREAD FOR THE WORLD UPDATE

News From Bread Indiana Lead Team about the letters we wrote in support for Bread for the World:

Fifty-three (53) congregations and other groups have reported sending 4,503 letters and verified emails to our members of Congress in support of those who are hungry. This exceeds our previous record of 46 groups sending 4,444 letters in 2019. Approximately 20 additional congregations are still planning letters for this year.

Thanks to all who have participated so far.

Letters are still needed since Congress will be working on the Farm Bill at least until September. The goal is to help end hunger in this country and globally. If you haven't already and would like the opportunity, perhaps consider sending a letter soon.

IS JUNETEENTH WORTH CELEBRATING?

A month ago, on the **4th of July**, we celebrated a federal holiday commemorating a huge event in the history of our nation, the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776! We were no longer controlled by the English colonies and could start the journey to become the United States of America. We usually celebrate this holiday with Family, Fun, Food and Fireworks! A few of us stop for a few seconds to think about and give thanks for **the priceless freedoms we have and take for granted as United States citizens**: freedom of choice in schooling, job training, where we live, job, transportation, marriage partner, children, beliefs, travel, investments, home, land, and business ownership, retirement plans, doctors, etc. Freedoms that we almost self-destructed through the Civil War, re-cemented through the patriotism of two World Wars, and put in jeopardy again with the capital insurrection on January 6, 2022.

Two months ago, on June 19, our country celebrated **Juneteenth** as a federal holiday for only the third time (starting in 2021). This holiday commemorates June 19, 1865, when enslaved people in Galveston, Texas, finally learned (two years after the Emancipation Proclamation was issued) they had been freed. **They were no longer someone's property! Each one was a person. The ultimate freedom!**

Should be a huge celebration... I would think. A few of us saw an article or headline in the news. Did Juneteenth have any meaning or significance at all to any of us? Did any of us stop to think what Juneteenth means to our Black friends? Did any of us stop to think what a celebration of the 4th of July freedoms means to a Black family who is still fighting the bureaucracy and systems in place to gain their rightful equality in America?

Is Juneteenth worth celebrating?

Prayer: Dear God: As we celebrate the Emancipation Proclamation and the end of the depravity of slavery, we pray that we work toward the day that all Americans can treat each other as equals regardless of the color of our skin. Amen.

First Presbyterian Church Valparaiso (public) and
