At the invitation of the Wabash Valley Presbytery, I attended conflict mediation training in Chicago at the Lombard Peace Institute last week. I was asked to receive training so that I could help congregations deal with conflict.

The five day event was paid by the Wabash Valley Presbytery and included six others from the presbytery. We joined seventy others that had gathered from around the country in Glen Ellyn, Illinois. The training was fabulous, and I did learn a great deal about conflict.

If I could summarize the thrust of the conference, (the takeaways) I learned that conflict is normal. It is a part of life.

John Paul Lederach in his incredible article, *“Understanding Conflict: The Experience, Dynamics and Structure of Conflict,”* states that most conversations about conflict begin by defining what conflict is. These definitions tell us much about what we believe about conflict.

How would you complete some of these sentences?

Conflict is like...?

My family does conflict like....?

I do conflict like a....?

The Western world views conflict as a source of heat (boiling, hot, simmering). Most of us do not have good words associated with conflict. Even the word, “conflict” is rooted in a Latin word that means “to strike together.” In the West, we expect friction when it comes to conflict. In a sense we feel out of balance and anticipate trouble.

The Chinese on the other hand use a symbol for conflict that implies danger and opportunity. Such a view does not view conflict as a collision but rather a challenge. Growth can take place.

All of us take our understanding of conflict into our disagreements. If there was a suggestion from the Lombard Institute about how to approach those situations it would be this:

1. Be hard on issues!
2. Be soft on people!

Our experience with conflict would be immeasurably more rich if we looked at conflict as normal with certain challenges. People are not to be viewed as the enemy. People are simply voicing their emotional viewpoints. We would all be better off if we were nicer toward people while fully examining the issues.

Aside from some of those golden nuggets, another stunning revelation (yet so obvious) was that conflict is found everywhere in the Bible. Stop and think about the many stories of conflict in the Bible. Conflict begins in Genesis and ends in Revelation. It is found everywhere.

In the Bible there are national enemies, oppressors, and even people in the church that are problematic. Jesus had problems with religious leaders and foreign powers. Satan is always creating conflict. In addition, the Apostle Paul had one conflicted church after another. That is the New Testament. The Old Testament is filled with conflict as well. I am reading a book detailing the conflict between Jacob and Esau. Think of Moses, Cain, Abel, David and Saul. Conflict is very much a part of the Bible.

Conflict in the church should not surprise us.

The greatest take away from the entire week at the Lombard Peace Institute for me was the emphasis upon getting conflicted people together. While this can seem risky and scary, the presenters were adamant that conflict resolution requires the warring parties to sit down and talk to each other. This is not another opportunity to shout anger and frustration. Rather, with a skilled mediator, the disgruntled parties are given a chance to speak and in turn reflect back what was heard by the other party. As differing views are shared, regrets are shared as well. Healing strategies come forth and people can move forward toward resolution.

Conflict! No one likes the word, yet it is one word we should come to expect as normal and one where we can grow deeper in our love for each other and for God.

Session began the August meeting by welcoming the familiar face of Nancy Porter. Many of you will remember Nancy who is the daughter of our former Librarian Georgia Coyle and the mother of Molly Randolph. Nancy has decided to bring her servant heart and join our congregation, so please welcome her as she “officially” joins the FPC family.

We are also grateful for the services of Becky Flannery! After volunteering in June with our Vacation Bible School team, Becky decided she needed to find another way to be involved, so she has agreed to teach in the Kids of the Kingdom program. We need more servant hearts like Becky and Nancy!

After much careful consideration, Finance Team has determined the distribution of a monetary gift from the estate of long-time member Dee Peller. Ten thousand dollars each will be distributed for Hand Bells, Mission & Ministry Fund, and Small Projects. We are certainly grateful for the generosity of the Pellers.

It is also the time of year that our Ministry Teams are beginning to craft budgets for next year. Pastor Mark reminded Moderators that priorities must be set and numbers crunched in order to achieve the goals that are most important to us as a church. If *you* have any suggestions, wishes, or budget items you think should be taken into consideration, be sure to speak with your Elders. Budget requests will be given to Finance by the end of September.

In late July, Membership Clerk Susan Grosick and I attended our Annual Minutes and Register review. During this meeting, Presbytery determines if we are keeping accurate minutes and records according to the requirements of the Book of Order. Thankfully, we passed with flying colors! In addition, we received suggestions and ideas about ways in which we can not only do our jobs better but also help our church to function both in the community and within the Presbytery. Presbytery also encourages Elders to participate in the larger church/Presbytery, and I have volunteer forms if any congregation member wishes to volunteer at the Presbytery level.

In happier news, what was reported last month about the retirement of our organist Janice Axmann isn't true anymore! Due to changes in her family situation, Janice will be able to remain as our organist, but in a slightly lesser capacity. She will be sharing her accompanist duties with Elder and Worship Team Moderator Brad Dirks who is actually a very familiar contributor to our musical worship.

As is often the case, Pastor Mark provided time for Elders to be in conversation with each other sharing thoughts and ideas for the good of the church. Topics included:

- The importance of the youth programs Ken Crews and Julia Evans have been developing (i.e., the West Virginia Mission Trip, Presbys, etc.)
- The popularity of the First Friday programs (including babysitting for parents!)
- The need to perhaps offer something for young parents during the Sunday school hour when their children are participating in Kids of the Kingdom.
- The upcoming webcast by Richard Rohr and others during Labor Day weekend.
- Nearly 1/3 of the tickets have been sold to the Carrie Newcomer concert and workshop, but Elders should strongly consider attending if they have not already purchased their tickets.
- Huge “Thank-you’s” to Sterling Miller and Zane Cole for reconfiguring the sound board, and to Simon Cole who is heading up the sound board techs!
- Excitement is building around the Church Picnic this Sunday.
- Rally Day for Sunday school is also this Sunday and TEACHERS are STILL NEEDED!
- Several Elders praised the recent addition of asking for prayer requests from the congregation during services. The connection with other members who have requests helps us realize that many have needs similar to our own!

- Sunday, September 2, 8:45 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

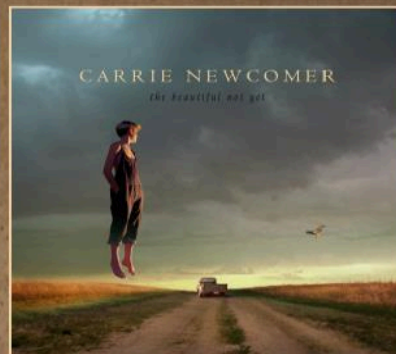

Most of us are familiar with the scholarships provided through our Endowment Scholarship Fund. You may not be aware, however, that as our Endowment Mission and Ministry Fund has grown, it too, is having an impact on our church. In fact, the combined Mission and Ministry dollars returned to the church in 2017 and 2018 are currently being used to support most of the costs associated with the upcoming Carrie Newcomer concert. The result is that First Presbyterian is not only able to sponsor a first rate, spiritually oriented concert and workshop experience for our members and surrounding community, but we are also able to use the proceeds generated from this special event to support a much deserving new neighbor, The Caring Place. This is a local and important Valparaiso organization that provides service and shelter to victims of violence and their children.

What wonderful gifts come back to the church and to each of us as a result of those who have directed legacy gifts to the Endowment!

During the last three years, the Endowment Scholarship Fund, primarily supported by the Lauterbach Scholarship gift, has distributed over \$13,000 in scholarships to our outstanding students. Approximately \$5,000 distributed over the last two years from the Mission and Ministry Fund will help support the Newcomer concert, and over \$3,400 has been distributed from the Music Fund of the Endowment to support the purchase of music and other related needs.

At this time gifts to the Endowment total \$208,015. After adjustments are considered (investment earnings, administrative and investment fees and the distributions that come back to the church) the Endowment balance reported to us by the Porter County Community Foundation (the organization that holds and invests our Endowment dollars) is \$229,459. Clearly, our Endowment is working well for First Presbyterian.

If you would like to consider making a legacy gift to the Endowment, a gift in which the principal is conserved and a portion of the earnings returned to the church annually, please feel free to contact a member of the committee.
