SESSION SYNOPSIS OF SEPTEMBER 15, 2021

With Labor Day behind us, kids and teachers all back in school, the slight hint of seasons beginning to change (days are definitely getting shorter and the mornings cooler!), your Session is working in overdrive with even more motions, informational items, and joys/concerns to share than last month!

MOTIONS:

➤ Session

1. At the October 3 Congregational Meeting, not only will we be **electing the new classes of Elders and Deacons**, but we will also be **voting on a change to our Bylaws**. You should have received an email blast detailing the change being proposed by Session and the rationale for that change. In effect, we hope to align our Bylaws with the Book of Order by allowing elders and deacons to serve for two consecutive terms rather than permitting them to serve only one term. Most Presbyterian churches follow this guideline, and Session feels it is appropriate to at least allow this as a possibility. If you have any questions, please contact Moderator Sharon Kinsey or *any* Elders who unanimously support this change.
2. Prospective new member **Debra Daugherty** shared her journey, was examined by Elders, approved for membership, and will be publicly joining FPCV with Harry and Jeanne Turner on September 26, 2021. We welcome them!
3. Deacons have been authorized (according to the Book of Order) to **serve communion to Deacon Friends** who are unable to attend in-person worship on World Communion Sunday, October 3, 2021. The elements will be blessed during the worship service and taken to them later that day.
4. Session has joyfully approved the upcoming October **Baptism** of Maisie, daughter of Maggi (Karabel) and Brandon Christy.
5. After considerable discussion initiated by the Worship Team, Session voted to *require masks to be worn inside the building for all activities whenever the CDC is recommending this action* (according to the CDC website: “if you are fully vaccinated, to maximize protection from the Delta variant and prevent possibly spreading it to others, wear a mask indoors in public if you are in an area of substantial or high transmission” (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/about-face-coverings.html>)). This decision will be revisited monthly.

➤ Worship

1. Sunday morning worship will remain **outdoors** in the Pavilion through the end of October, weather permitting.
2. When we must move indoors for Sunday worship, *masks will be required for everyone over the age of 2 regardless of vaccination status.*

➤ Mission

1. Session approved a **fundraiser** for Melissa Klancer to raise money for Parkinson’s research. Melissa has qualified to run in the Chicago Marathon on October 10, 2021, with the Michael J. Fox “Team Fox.”

Informational Items:

- While praying for the Wider Community, Elder Rick Exley shared what an amazing ministry is taking place at the **Presbyterian Resale Shop**. While many of our Presbyterian women are well aware of what has been going on since the shop was established back in 1942 (nearly 80 years ago!), it is always good to publicize how much good they do by selling gently used clothing, housewares, small appliances, books, toys, etc., all at *very* low prices. They are still able to take in large amounts of money which they in turn donate back to our local community.
- Worship Team has determined that beginning Sunday, September 26, 2021, passing of the **offering plates** will resume. For those who still feel uncomfortable passing the plates, separate offering plates will continue to be available before entering the worship space.
- There will be a **Called Meeting of the Session** following worship on Sunday, September 26, 2021, for the purpose of receiving an update from the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee. Some of the survey results have already been shared with the congregation, but Co-moderators Cathy Greenawald and Jim Hubbard plan to go into more detail when meeting with the Session while also asking specifically what steps Session would recommend next.
- Finance Moderators Lisa Pavlopoulos and Marc Buehler shared timelines for preparing our 2022 **Budget** as well as the upcoming Stewardship campaign which is rumored to be concluding with the first ever **FPCV Tailgate Party** for the Bears/Packers football game on October 17!
- Following a discussion that has been on-going for several months, Session has directed former Membership Clerk Susan Grosick to revise a letter that has been used in the past and send it to non-attending members whom elders have tried to contact as prescribed by the Book of Order. In addition, Membership Team members will be contacting financial contributors who have not been attending.
- As many are aware from reading the news recently, there are thousands of **Afghan refugees** entering our country. Most of these refugees have come with nothing more than the clothes on their backs, so they have tremendous needs, both immediate and long-term. Several members of our church along with Pastor Kim, as well as several members of our sister church Trinity Lutheran, have met to discuss the possibility of helping with the resettlement of some of these refugees in some way. If you too have such an interest, please contact Pastor Kim and look for more details to come as the discussions move forward and possibilities are explored.

Praises/Joys/Prayers/Concerns:

- Prayers are ongoing for Elder Ken McAloon who is currently in Kenya on a two-week mission trip serving Pastor Henry's church.
- Prayers of thankfulness as well as continued healing for Elder Trish Lawson following her recent surgery
- Praises abound for the recent sermon series and adult classes on Joy! Worship has been filled with the multiple joys of music, the sounds of nature, kids on the playground, laughter, and people staying long after services are over to reconnect and enjoy being together again. Many thanks for the leadership of CE Director Ken Crews and CE Moderator Sharon Kinsey for their leadership.
- Participating in communion together as well as the practice of laying on of hands have also brought more meaningful joy to our community
- Prayers are needed for our Cub Scout troop which is experiencing difficulties and may be forced to disband.
- Prayers are requested for the people of Florida (especially Pastor Kim's mother) where COVID and lax protocols have few available beds in hospitals, medical personnel are leaving the profession due to exhaustion and impossible working conditions, and where friends may not survive.

Important Information for Anyone Who Can Check All the Boxes

- _____ **I am 70 or older.**
- _____ **I have an IRA.**
- _____ **I donate money to the church (and/or charities).**

On our Federal Taxes, most of us now take the standard deduction of \$12,000 (single) or \$24,000 (married) rather than itemizing, and thus we no longer get a tax deduction for money we give to qualified charities such as the church. However, if you checked the three boxes above, **you still can donate money and lower your taxes.** Here is why and how:

Beginning at age 70½ (72*), you must take a specified amount, your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), out of your IRA each year. You must now start paying the taxes you avoided when you put the money in the IRA. (*Anyone who did not turn 70½ by January 1, 2020 is not required to start taking RMD's until age 72).

Assume Mary is required to take \$3,000 out of her IRA this year. She also wants to give \$3,000 to the church and/or other charitable organizations.

1. She can have this money sent to herself. It is considered income, and she would pay \$1,025 more in taxes (if she is in the 32% tax bracket). $\$3,000 - \$1,025$ (to taxes) = **\$1,975 left for charities**
2. She can request this money be sent directly to an IRS approved charity, such as the church, and she would pay no taxes on this money. $\$3,000 - \0 = **the full \$3,000 goes to the church!**
3. Yes, if she wanted to donate only \$2,000, she could have \$1,000 (\$680 after taxes) sent to her.
4. Also, she can request the money be distributed among several charities.

These donations are called **Qualified Charitable Deductions (QCD's)**.

All it takes is a phone call to the custodian of your IRA (or your accountant/financial advisor). He/she can help you set up the process and timing for sending out your QCD checks this year.

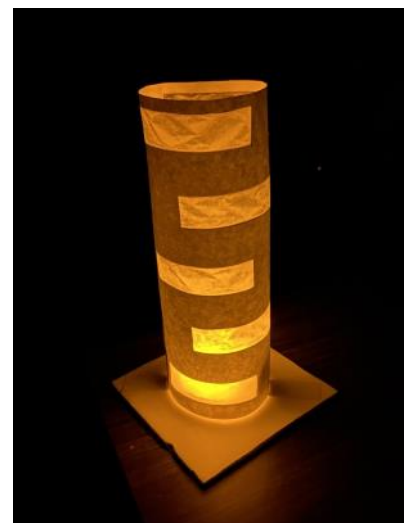

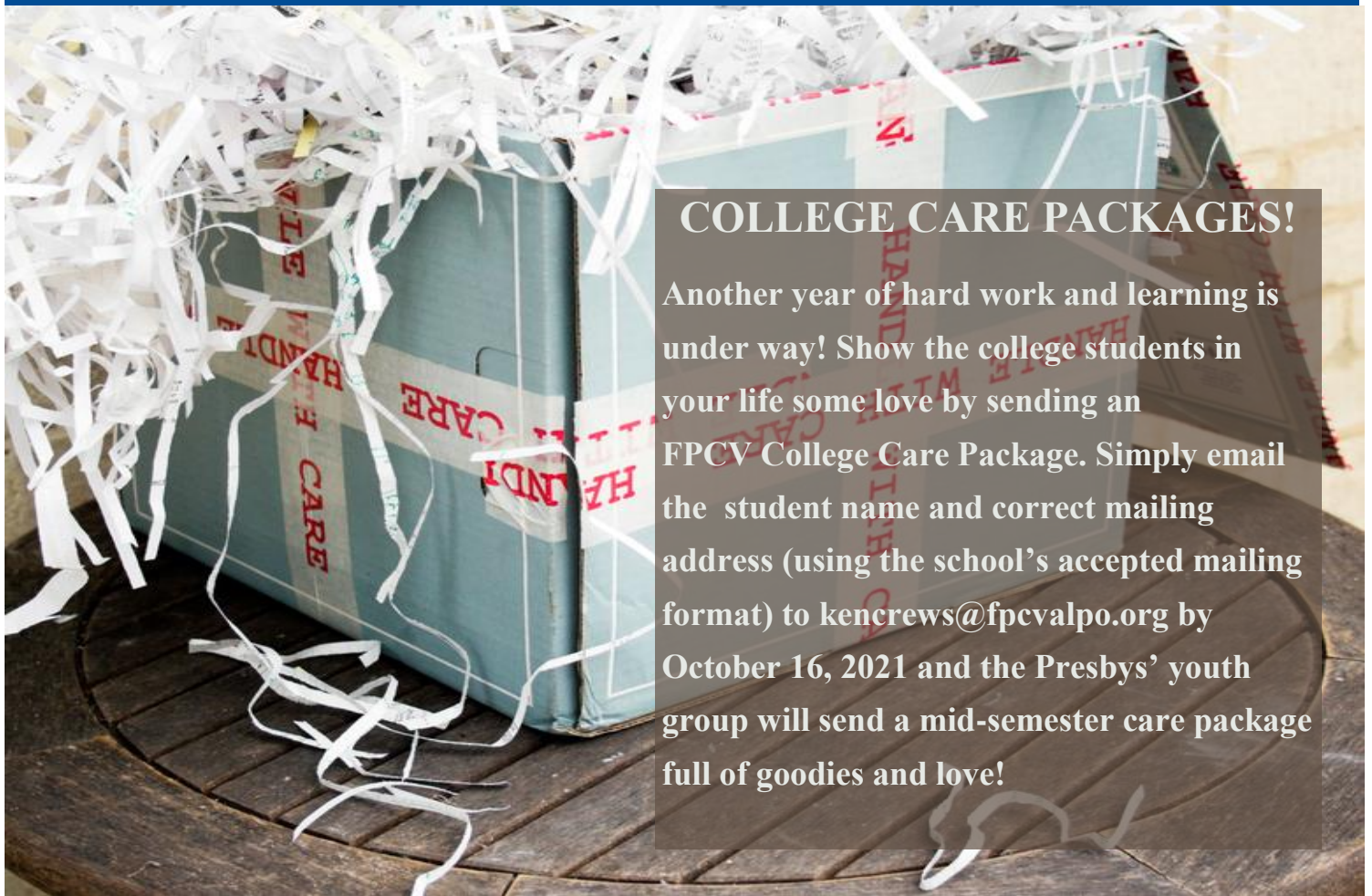

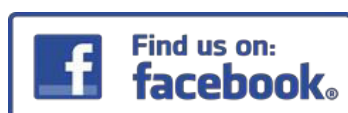
